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## Drink up! Ave Maria's water tastes great

For years Ave Maria Utility Company (AMUC) has been consistently serving the Ave Maria community with excellent drinking water. The company's hard work was recognized in 2010 and 2014 when it was awarded Best Tasting Drinking Water by the Florida Section of the American Water Works Association-Region V. FSAWWA "advances public health, safety and welfare by uniting the efforts of the full spectrum of the entire water community."

AMUC was crowned winner of the 2021 contest in August, adding a third win to its resume and another testament to its outstanding service.

The Best Tasting Drinking Water contest is for utility companies from Collier, Hendry, and Lee counties and considers a variety of criteria, including aroma, taste, clarity, and color.

AMUC Lead Operator Ray Carter, who pulled and delivered the water sample for the 2021 contest, says about his team's continued excellent work: "We pay close attention to our water quality and are very proud of our awards."

Mr. Carter is proud that the entire process for drinking water treatment is done "right here in Ave Maria. We pump water from the Tamiami aguifer and process it through membrane treatment and degasification. It's all done on-site, from the ground to our customers' taps."

AMUC serves nearly 7,000 people in the Ave Maria area as well as four Collier County public schools. Services include drinking water treatment and distribution, wastewater treatment, and reclaim (reuse) for irrigation.

Plant Operations Manager Paul Cortez notes the facility is 100% reuse, meaning used water undergoes a multi-step treatment process before it is recirculated for irrigation use.

"Our Ave Maria residents are our main priority," Mr. Cortez says.

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
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
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#### Meet a Townmaker:

## Peninsula Engineering President John English

Growing up in Fort Myers, John English enjoyed math and science, participating on the math team at Riverdale High School but also finding time to play football and tennis.

College was an easy choice.

"A large number of my family members, including my father, went to the University of Florida," he says. "And if you know any Florida Gators, they tend to brainwash their child. I was bleeding orange and blue from a young age."

He graduated with a bachelor of science degree in engineering in

1995, which he says was perfect timing for his field.

"Southwest Florida was coming out of a recessionary period, so land development was on the rise. It was right at the beginning of the real estate boom that lasted from 1995 to 2006."

Mr. English spent 16 years with the engineering firm WilsonMiller, working on projects such as Pelican Marsh and Grey Oaks. "It was a great company with great clients," he says.

One of those clients happened to be Barron Collier Companies, and one of the projects was the beginning stages of Ave Maria around 2003.

"It was exhilarating," Mr. English recalls. "It was a big thing to build a town in the middle of a tomato farm. It was a challenge, but I was very excited to take it on."

He notes that, unlike developing in existing

areas that have roads for access and utilities to connect to, the engineers had to figure out everything from irrigation to sewers.

One of the earliest challenges, he says, was figuring out "how do you make a plan for 5,000 acres?"

The answer, he adds, was drawing "lots and lots of concepts."

As part of a large group, Mr. English helped with the planning, design, permitting, and construction of Ave Maria.

One team was designing the university, another focused on the Town Center, and Pulte started thinking about the residential areas.

There was a lot of permitting, zoning, and infrastructure required.

But all the hard work paid off.

"I'm proud that the town was successfully built and works," he says.

He was hired by Peninsula Engineering, a subsidiary of Barron Collier Companies, 10 years ago. He serves as president of engi"It was a big thing to build a town in the middle of a tomato farm. It was a challenge, but I was very excited to take it on."

neering and has been involved in additional projects such as housing developments and the new Founders Square coming to North Naples (see related story on page 21).

"Engineering is a great career and there's a big need for it," Mr. English says. "The population is growing and that growing population needs places to live, places to shop, places to recreate, and roads and utilities to get there."

He also says engineers take on a lot of responsibility. "We sign and seal all our designs, and that's a little unique. We're entrusted with the health, safety, and welfare of the public."

Speaking of health, Mr. English is a runner who once completed the New York City Marathon.

"I finished but didn't set any records," he laughs. "It was a lot harder than I thought it would be."

He enjoys spending time with his family, watching any Florida Gator game and cheering on the Pittsburgh Steelers.

As Ave Maria continues to grow, Mr. English recalls all the site consultants who were involved.

"A lot of good people have worked on the town," he says.

The schools are a labor of love for owner Lanie Bonaquist Hill, who has a bachelor's degree in psychology with a focus in youth and family from the University of Florida,

as well as 12 years of experience in child-related fields.

"I have never had a job that didn't include caring for children," she says. "After graduating, I moved back to my hometown of Naples and worked as a preschool teacher, and I realized how



much I loved that setting. I created a business plan, got a loan from the bank, and opened The Palm Preschool-Marquesa. It has been such a rewarding and fulfilling experience."

Parents have flocked to the Naples school since its opening. "I think we've created a great school, and our enrollment reflects that," Mrs. Hill says. "I knew we wanted to expand, and Ave Maria was in need of a child care facility, so we decided to take that on."

Playing an integral role in the success of The Palm is Executive Director Natasha Norgart, who has an extensive child care background, as well as passion for the work she has done since she was 16.

"I took all the child care classes that were offered in high school," Mrs. Norgart says. She earned an associate's degree in child care from Santa Fe College in Gainesville. In Naples, she taught at the Temple Shalom preschool

before helping Mrs. Hill open The Palm Preschool-Marquesa.

As in the Naples location, The Palm Preschool-Ave Maria will follow the Teaching Strategies Creative Curriculum, which employs a learning-through-play education model.

"The idea is to make it fun and exciting, so they're learning through play," Mrs. Norgart says. "For example, if the 3-year-olds are focusing on name writing, we teach them how to trace their names in kinetic sand or shaving cream."

Children rotate to a new activity in a different area of the classroom every 15 minutes.

Having two teachers per classroom allows

for this dynamic use of the space and plenty of one-on-one time with the kids. Lessons range from sensory activities with Play-Doh and magnetic building blocks that encourage kids to use their imagination to fun activities that introduce mathematics and literacy. Taking cues from the children's actions and responses, instructors will explore teachable moments while always keeping it light and fun. Every week there is a theme, which might involve holidays like Valentine's Day or St. Patrick's Day, where they consider the meaning of love or good luck, or broader topics like weather, exploring the different types of cloud formations, for example.

Mrs. Hill believes preschool is not just for

dual-working parents who need a nice place to take their children while they're at their jobs.

"We strive for our schools to be a fun and educational environment for every child," she says. "Our job is to facilitate social and emotional development. We are monitored by the state and use a highly regarded curriculum, so parents can be confident that their children are hitting all their age-appropriate milestones and then some. We pride ourselves on having the best staff who truly cares about the well-being of every one of our students."

Celebrating an undersea theme, the interior walls of the school will be painted different shades of teal, and the teachers will customize the decor in their respective classrooms. Each grade level will be assigned its own maritime mascot, such as dolphins, sea turtles, and jellyfish. "We've gotten great feedback at our current location on how bright and welcoming each classroom is" Mrs. Norgart

The Palm requires all of its teachers to have 45 hours of training through the DCF and to be credentialed for their positions. They are all background-checked and finger-printed through the state of Florida.

At 5068 Annunciation Circle, Suite 109, The Palm Preschool-Ave Maria will be open from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. weekdays. Fees range from \$220 to \$275 per week, depending on the age group. Morning and afternoon snacks are included, and a catered lunch will be available for an added cost.

Although student enrollment has not yet begun, Mrs. Hill invites Ave Maria parents to visit www.palmpreschool.com and fill out the inquiry form on the Contact Us page, noting interest in the Ave Maria location. Mrs. Norgart will follow up with these parents and get them on a waiting list.

ranteur Michael Jaenvega, the owner of Martin Fierro Argentinean Steakhouse in Naples and the Martin Fierro With a Twist food truck.

Ave Maria locals will recognize the food truck as a frequent vendor at festivals and events, and a regular visitor at businesses around the town. OASIS The Kitchen Lounge now brings South American flair to a brick-and-mortar location in the heart of the Town Center.

Mr. Jaenvega is the mastermind behind OASIS' diverse menu that includes South American flavors and dishes while incorporating a variety of options, including pasta,

poke bowls, sandwiches, flatbreads, and filet and ribeye steaks. A full cocktail menu is also available.

Mr. Ho describes the restaurant as "a fun, vibrant, upscale concept with a mix of food." He adds, "OASIS is called a kitchen because the eclectic menu will be constantly evolving with new choices and limited specials."

For the decoration and atmosphere of OASIS, the two men looked to interior designer Jorge Arroyo. Arroyo is another member of the Ave Maria community who, along with his wife, Reina del Mar Torres, owns Hoja De Menta boutique.

Mr. Arroyo and Ms. Torres took inspiration from the restaurant's name to make OASIS "a place where people can escape and have a good time and enjoy the ambience." Various aspects of nature — the desert, rivers, the woods — are incorporated throughout the restaurant and bar area.

"It's a concept that's so beautiful and artis-

tic that people will be awed when they walk in," Mr. Ho says about the innovative interior design. The 2,500-square-foot restaurant seats approximately 95 patrons inside and has outdoor patio seating for up to 60 patrons.

Menu prices at OASIS are in the moderate to upper range, with steaks at \$33.

## Plans underway for new Ave Maria Elementary School

Children in Ave Maria will have a new place to learn for the 2025-2026 school year. Ave Maria Elementary School will serve the growing population in town.

"With sales really accelerating the past several years at Ave Maria and a lot of families moving in, it was the right time to get this started," says Nick Casalanguida, senior vice president of development at Barron Collier Companies, the developers of Ave Maria.

The new K-5 school for 500 students will be on Anthem Parkway just east of Ave Maria Boulevard, north of the water park and east of North Park. Mr. Casalanguida says there is also room on the property for an eventual middle school as well.

Ave Maria Development gave the land to the school district, which will manage the educational facility.

According to Mr. Casalanguida, the project will cost \$1.5 million to \$2 million in design and civil engineering fees and \$22 million to \$24 million in construction hard costs. It is being funded by impact fees, though Ave Maria Development will finance \$15 million to \$20 million for the project and get repaid through the fees during the next four to six years.

Barron Collier Companies met with staff at Collier County Public Schools last year to start the process. RG Architects out of Fort Myers has been hired to design the new school. The firm has worked with the School District of Lee County, Community School of Naples, and Lorenzo Walker Technical College, among other educational institutions.

Mr. Casalanguida says the building will have reinforced walls, protective features, and monitoring at entrances and exits. There will also be other advancements in modern teaching elements such as active whiteboards where

students can directly participate. The school will be approximately 65,000-75,000 square feet, have two stories in some parts, and feature energy-efficient components. Portions of the building will be hardened, and the entire facility will be able to be used as an emergency shelter. Additionally, the site will have backup generator capability.

For safety reasons, amenities such as sports fields will not be open to the public, but Mr. Casalanguida notes that Ave Maria has many parks and recreational spaces for residents.

Peninsula Engineering, a subsidiary of Barron Collier Companies, is also part of the project.

The winning contractor, out of eight that

submitted bids, is Tampa-based Charles Perry Partners, whose clients include University of

Florida, University of Central Florida, Virginia Tech, Stetson University, and many other colleges, universities, and school districts.

Mr. Casalanguida says Barron Collier Companies and school district representatives are holding biweekly production meetings. He expects the design process to continue through this year and horizontal construction to begin in late 2022 or the first quarter of 2023, with that phase lasting eight to 10 months. Vertical construction is expected to begin in the fall of

2024. The actual timing will depend on final design features, construction costs, and the funding plan. Current forecasts are for opening in the fall of 2025.

"The community is excited, and we're happy to do this," he says. "The collaboration with the school district has been wonderful. Kudos to Superintendent Dr. Kamela Patton and her team. They've been a pleasure to work with."


#### **Donahue Academy**

Local residents helped motivate the team.


"We were very pleased by the support of the Ave Maria community, twice setting home game attendance records," Mr. Hampton says.



## New restaurants whet appetites for Founders Square

When residents in Ave Maria want to venture beyond all the fabulous restaurants in town, The Pointe at Founders Square is now open a short drive away in North Naples. It's part of the 55-acre Founders Square being developed by Barron Collier Companies (the developers of Ave Maria) and Metro Commercial Development on the southeast corner of Immokalee Road and Collier Boulevard

The mixed-use site will have everything from dining, shopping, and entertainment to healthcare, storage facilities, and residences.

"There's a shortage of restaurant options and other uses in this area and we're filing that need," says Eric Mallory, executive vice president with Metro Commercial Development.

The first restaurants to open this winter were the 12th location of local breakfast and lunch chain Skillets and

the first Southwest Florida location of national chain I Heart Mac and Cheese. Other dining options that plan to open this spring include Fuji Sushi, Outback Steakhouse, South Street



Just a short drive from Ave Maria, The Pointe at Founders Square at the southeast corner of Immokalee Road and Collier Boulevard in North Naples will be home to a wide array of retail, entertainment and service businesses.

City Oven & Grill, and Tacos & Tequila. Crisp and Physicians Regional Healthcare System area, especially from south of the site as well as & Green will follow later in the year. All the restaurants have outdoor dining available.

Two businesses — Collier Urgent Care & Spa are in the buildout phase but have yet to

— have also opened their doors. Salon Bellezza, Gulf Coast Orthodontics, and Luxury Nails announce opening dates.

A three-story, 110,000-square-foot self-storage tower is open, and 400 apartments are under construction, with some already occupied.

Also under development is The Plaza, an open-air center that will be anchored by a Sunshine Ace Hardware store and that will also have restaurants, retailers, and other services. Mr. Mallory says negotiations are already taking place for 50% of the 27,000-squarse-foot space and include three restaurants that do not yet have a presence in Southwest Florida as well as a major fitness operator.

Two of the seven outparcels are also under construction. Mr. Mallory says a 7-11 is expected to open by August, and the second site will be a branch office of First Foundation Bank.

Several restaurants are interested in the remaining outparcels, he says, noting that "there's a significant need for dining in this area."

Mr. Mallory says he expects Founders Square to draw residents from a wide east, including Ave Maria.

"This is the direction of progress," he says. 🤽



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

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
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
