





Nov. 11 dedication and grand opening.

Anderson Richardson, president of the Ave Maria Veterans Association and a 26-year U.S. Army veteran, expressed gratitude, stating, "This was a whole community effort, and the memorial could not have happened without full community support behind it. We received donations from little kids to \$25,000. The memorial is not just for veterans, it's for the entire Ave Maria community. We proposed the memorial and the town just ran with it."

Situated alongside a large lake, the Veterans Memorial stands at 4840 Ave Maria Boulevard. The American flag, a literal and figurative centerpiece atop a 4-foot-tall black pad, was raised to its full 25 feet for the first time in November. Surrounding the 60-foot circle are the flags of the six U.S. armed forces – Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marine Corps, Navy and Space Force – with the surface adorned in 8-by-8-inch pavers honoring loved ones.

The memorial boasts additional features, including a steel sculpture of a kneeling sol-

dier in silhouette donated by resident Marc Moreau, and a 9-foot-tall, 15-foot-long wall showcasing colored granite service medallions of each military branch. The wall also features expressions of gratitude recognizing U.S. veterans for their heroism and sacrifice, with the poignant phrase, "We don't know them all, but we owe them all."

The Veterans Association successfully raised \$140,000 for the memorial. Funds

were collected through various channels, including weekly farmers markets, contributions from local businesses, the ongoing Flagpoles for Veterans program (which generated \$23,000), and proceeds from two charity golf tournaments. The third annual scramble, the Association's primary fundraiser, takes place on Friday, Dec. 8, at Panther Run golf course in Del Webb Naples.

Generous donations were made on behalf

of the William and Patricia LaMothe family foundation, the Del Webb Veterans Club, and Michael Schwartz of Ave Maria Mutual Funds. Schwartz's \$15,000 contribution included 35 brick pavers dedicated to each U.S. conflict or war since the Revolutionary War. Additional support came from the 2023 Sunshine State Steak Cook-Off, with matching funds provided by Modern Woodman.

The Ave Maria Stewardship Community and Ave Maria Development played crucial roles by providing an easement on the land and assisting with permitting, design elements and electrical service.

David Genson, president of development for Barron Collier Companies, emphasized the town's unity, stating, "Through this process, it has been incredible to witness the town come together in support of our veterans and townspeople to make this a reality. As the developer of the town of Ave Maria, we see the value the Veterans Memorial brings to our community members."

Thomas Schlessinger, vice president of the Veterans Association and memorial project manager, said, "Over the course of the last four years, we raised enough money to fund the memorial. People have gone above and beyond to support the project and recognize

veterans and the sacrifices they've made."

The value of total community support exceeded \$200,000, according to Schlessinger, including donated materials, in-kind services and pro-bono hours from engineering and design profressionals.

The idea for the memorial emerged shortly after the founding of the Veterans Association in 2018. Despite initial challenges with no funding or design, the fledgling flagpole project, which allocated \$35 from every private home installation to the organization, showcased Ave Maria's patriotism. Residents actively participated by purchasing flagpoles for veterans and their neighbors.

Paver sales, available at avemariavets. org, continue to fund ongoing maintenance.

Schlessinger discovered a heartening reversal in sentiment from companies eager to provide free or heavily discounted materials in support of the effort; a stark change from public sentiment following his return from the Vietnam War.

"For the longest time, veterans didn't get recognition. People are so appreciative and thankful today, and it makes you feel good," expressed the veteran Marine. "For me, this is an opportunity to provide recognition for my generation, the generations before me and after me, to help other veterans get the recognition they deserve. The people at Ave Maria are very supportive of veterans and first responders.

Steinbeck Way, Ave Maria's Homegrown Rock Band

Being in a band takes on a unique beauty as you age, a truth realized by the members of Ave Maria's Steinbeck Way. Wisdom and maturity naturally temper the ego and irrationality of youth when you hit ages 50 and 60. Forget overcrowded garages; as homeowners on Steinbeck Way in Ave Maria, their practice space is now a much nicer place.

Lead singer Jack West humorously noted that the music remains constant in his nearly 50-year hiatus: "I was in bands in the 70s, and it's the same music today. The only difference now is it hurts more tearing down the equipment and lifting the cases."

The Naples-based blues, rock and soul cover band, focuses on music from the '50s to the present. With three distinct singers covering different styles, they create a unique blend of sounds, specializing in playing upbeat dance music.

Expressing a deep love for song and sound, the band draws inspiration from the greatest rock musicians, recreating their heroes' best tunes while injecting their unique style. Their classic rock repertoire covers iconic bands like The Beatles, BTO, Cream, The Eagles, Golden Earring, Janis Joplin, Lynyrd Skynyrd, Pat Benatar, R.E.M., The Stones, ZZ Top and more.

Steinbeck Way is more than a band; they are a group of musicians and friends with a story that began long ago, crafting individual styles and waiting for the right moment. In April 2022, talents intersected, and the band was born. Those early days were exploratory, but slowly, they discovered their sound, audience, and purpose. Today, they play in and around Naples and Ave Maria, constantly adding to their setlist, determined to give their audience a great time.

"Our name is founded on our origin and the drive we each share to be a part of our community and the well-being of our neighbors and friends. For us, Steinbeck Way is also our attitude. Our songs, you see, we play the Steinbeck Way." shared West.

"We take people back on a trip through time... When we play songs like Golden Earring's 'Radar Love,' they remember what they were doing when the song first came out and dance. That's what makes our show. We've done our job," West said.

Steinbeck Way also includes founder and lead guitarist Chris Webb, singer and supporting instrumentalist Mitzy Seijo, drummer Glenn Dove and bassist Drew Turner. The band has been playing since April 2022, brought together by the randomness of chance encounters and karaoke. Karaoke nights at Ave Maria's in-town pub and brewery brought West and Seijo to Webb's attention.

"We all just clicked. We became a family in a short time," said West, whose non-band decades were focused on career and family. "It couldn't work any other way."

"Everyone has different backgrounds and we all just connected," said Dove, a lifelong professional musician who toured with Ram Jam for two years in the late 70s during the height of the group's "Black Betty" single.

Dove moved from New York to Ave Maria in 2021, allotting six months to get acclimated before venturing into the local music scene. Dove's wife happened upon Webb's online message looking for a drummer, and to confirm his experience, Dove sent Webb a photo of the ten sets in the drum room of his Del Webb Naples home.

Steinbeck Way was named not as an ode to the famous author, but a location. West and Webb, as they soon found out, live only five houses apart on Steinbeck Way, and Turner is two blocks away. Despite volleying through hundreds of possible band names, the group eventually settled on the two words consistently referenced in texts detailing the next practice session at Webb's home.

Since landing their first gig at Oil Well Craft Beer in June 2022, Steinbeck Way's fanbase and dance card have expanded exponentially. The band has performed throughout Ave Maria, for intimate audiences at private parties and restaurants, and for larger crowds during town-wide events and in the Grand Hall at Del Webb Naples. Steinbeck Way is making an encore appearance at Taste of Ave Saturday, Feb. 4.

"I love that, playing downtown in front of all your peers at Taste of Ave," said West. "The bigger the venue, the better."

For Dove, who's appeared on the same bills as Steppenwolf and Molly Hatchet before audiences of 10,000 or more, performing in a hometown band, in Florida versus New York City is obviously different, sometimes comically so. Smaller stages provide a personal connection between musician and music lover.

"When you play really big shows you don't see the audience," he said. "There's also the joke that at Ave Maria and Del Webb, we only play until 9 p.m. With some of the newer venues, we're scheduled until 11 p.m. or 1 a.m.—in New York City you were at a club until 3 a.m."

Word of mouth and Steinbeck Way's reputation for danceable, universally appealing music are also driving its success.







Unearthing Our Forgotten History: Ave Maria's Fort Doane

Nestled in eastern Collier County, Ave Maria's stunning landscapes and vibrant communities have become sanctuary for many of Florida's most notable animals and native plants, and with thousands of acres of preserves surrounding Town, a historic past remains protected in the area's mix of royal palms and swamps.

Located west of Town is the site of Fort Doane, a former U.S. military supply camp and army depot during the Second Seminole War, which served soldiers on reconnaissance missions for up to two days at a time. The camp was garrisoned by the 8th Infantry: Companies B, C, D, E and I under the command of William Jenkins Worth. The fort's scouting parties consisted of 30 to 40 soldiers, with 10 to 20 men remaining as guard during infirmary leave.

The Seminole Wars - spanning across 1816 to 1858 – were among the longest and costliest conflicts in United States history, having imprinted a forever mark on the legacy of present-day Collier County and the surrounding regions. Eight army forts were built near what would geographically now be called our county: Old Fort Foster, Fort Poinsett, Fort Harell, Fort Keias, Fort Doane, Fort Keys, Fort Simon Drum and Fort Cross. Local historians, like Dr. Emily Thompson, have uncovered evidence suggesting this Southwest Florida area became a significant battleground during the Second Seminole War (1835 - 1842), as the U.S. Army aimed to remove Seminoles from the southern lands and place them in western reservations.

Established during the second war's Big Cypress Campaign on Dec. 21, 1841, Ave Maria's fort was named in honor of Sergeant John Doane of the same infantry, who died in combat the day prior – a fellow soldier killed the same day, Private William Foster - would be honored by Old Fort Foster, the earliest military post in Collier County. But, by January 1842, the Doane camp was abandoned after one month of militant use. Background research suggests several trails were used in a transportation network which linked various forts in the Big Cypress vicinity including Doane with neighboring camp, Fort Keias, located near Immokalee's Lake Trafford.

In 2003, Florida historian Dr. Knetch documented that "Fort Doane's manifest would have consisted of food and ammunition [balls and caps for Mississippi percussion rifles]. These supplies would have arrived at the fort site via wagons pulled by mules and stored either in a log or plank enclosure, with tarpaulin tents providing shelter when troops rested."

As awareness grew, efforts were underway to preserve and interpret the site. In 2004, Barron Collier Companies (BCC), developer of Ave Maria, proposed the site require a thorough archaeological survey – field work began that following May, covering close to 5,000 acres.

"The purpose of the historic site campaign was to locate and identify any prehistoric and historic period sites or structures located within the Ave Maria property," said author Ralph Van Blarcom of "Seminole War Artifacts & A History of the Forts of Florida."

Intensive metal detecting and subsurface archeological testing were conducted in the effort, and as a result, no evidence was found, determining the abandoned fort area as a "general vicinity location historic archaeological site," with address labeled: NE 2 miles County Road 858, 6 miles W of State Road 29. There is no public access to this location.

"Although no physical evidence of the Seminole War's Fort Doane installation

or any 19th century occupation was found within the project area, BCC recognizes the importance of Seminole War history to Collier County and Southwest Florida," said Ron Jamro, former director of Collier County Museums.

After construction of Ave Maria's Town Center began in February 2006, some debate rumbled post-archeological dig, as historians and historical societies disagreed with the State of Florida's conclusions and believed the Fort Doane site of the Second Seminole War was moved and became active again during the Third War.

"The site of Fort Doane was first identified in the 1940s by D. Graham Copeland as the site of Fort Keias, although his own notes indicate that he may have been misled by local traditions... A review of the contemporary maps of this period indicates the site is indeed Fort Doane," stated the 8CR660 Florida report.

It was soon determined that Fort Doane, originally situated near Ave Maria, was relocated five miles northwest when recommissioned for duty during the Third Seminole War. The new location placed it in proximity to the bustling army installation known as Camp [Fort] Keias, positioned northeast of Doane's initial site.

The coordinates for Fort Doane during the Second Seminole War were 81°27°100° longitude and 26°16°500 latitude, while during the Third Seminole War, the coordinates shifted to 81°30°900° longitude and 26°19°550 latitude.

In his journals, Copeland observed the site as "a series of trenches from six inches to one-foot-deep running partly at angles eastward from the Cypress and thence southerly and easterly a distance of about 500 feet thence westerly about 200 feet to the Cypress."

The discovery and preservation of Fort Doane and its land serves as a reminder that lying deep in our marshes is a complex Florida history deserving of recognition. As the years progressed, it remained a duty to the Barron Collier Companies and Ave Maria Development to guard the fort site, having permanently staked the area once led by artillery-filled wagons and commands.




















In August, Maple Ridge residents Okkie and Charl Van Wyk purchased the Town Center's Ave Maria Dance Academy and have been setting the place abuzz for the past three months with strategic renovations, a fresh slate of instructors, expanded class offerings and numerous plans for the future.

According to Okkie, this labor of love came to pass in large part because her daughter Adryan has been studying dance since she was three years old. "We've experienced firsthand the joy of dance. It has shown my daughter growth, strength and confidence throughout the years," she explained. "From a parent's perspective, I can bond with my daughter as a backstage mom, driving her to recitals, helping her with costumes and makeup. I've seen her grow into a beautiful, mature dancer and independent person. This could be a legacy that we leave her, a studio where she will be able to continue her passion for dance and offer others the opportunity to dance."

A freshman with a dance scholarship from Ave Maria University (AMU), Adryan performs on the Gyrenes Dance Team. She is also one of the dance academy's eight new instructors, most of which are AMU undergrads and lifelong dancers. The academy is looking to hire a few high school students as teaching assistants, offering leadership and mentoring experience for the right candi-

According to Okkie, the most dedicated,

"We're collaborating with the Immokalee Chamber of Commerce and the Ave Maria Master Association to get our performers out into the community. The Dance Company is the face of Ave Maria Dance Academy," she remarked. "It's something for younger girls to work toward. They take more dance classes, are expected to learn choreography very quickly, and will generally work harder."

With a focus on optimizing the space and making dancers comfortable, academy renovations include a modern, pleasing color scheme, new flooring in the lobby and dance studio, ballet barres on the walls to expand studio space and functionality, a dancers' lounge for relaxing and making friends, bathroom upgrades and a dedicated store with leotards and dance supplies.

Wheels of Resilience: Ave Maria's Bike Club

Bicycles are ubiquitous in Ave Maria, seamlessly blending into the landscape alongside palm trees and pickleball courts, serving various purposes from basic transportation to recreation and exercise.

Paul Klempert, 71-year-old founder of the Ave Maria Bike Club, sat outside The Bean in late October, reflecting on the early days of the Bike Club, previously known as Flat Tyres.

"People are interested in other activities here besides just tennis, pickleball and bocce," Klempert remarked. Undeterred by Florida's scorching summer days, Klempert continued to ride, making a concession to the heat by advising, "Just bring two water bottles."

Klempert delved into his passion for cycling, the club, and his remarkable comeback from what initially seemed like a death sentence - a Stage 4 pancreatic cancer diagnosis.

Fortunately, Klempert clarified that it was a misdiagnosis, crediting the Sylvester Comprehensive Cancer Center in Miami for determining he didn't have cancer but instead had pancreatitis. This determination set him on the path to recovery, both in terms of health and pedaling the roads of Ave Maria on one of his three Trek bicycles.

"Thank God for the Sylvester Cancer Center," Klempert said. Experiencing symptoms such as jaundice, itching on the arms, and a lack of energy, his weight dropped from 241 pounds to 169 pounds over roughly a threeweek span. Having since added a few pounds, he underwent regular check-ups, with his last one in August.

Club vice president John Hibler fondly recalled meeting Klempert on Oil Well Road three years ago, a moment that forged a lasting connection. As Hibler pedaled along, he noticed Klempert seemingly stranded on the roadside, initially thinking it was due to a flat tire. However, to his surprise, Klempert's tires were in good condition, and the stop was for an entirely different reason. This encounter marked the beginning of a friendship rooted in their shared enthusiasm for the Bike Club.

Hibler, reflecting on the Ave Maria community and the club, described it as a very warm and welcoming place where friend-

ships effortlessly take root. "You just meet more people on the bike," Hibler said, emphasizing the camaraderie within the club and highlighting the ease of forming connections compared to traditional activities like golf. According to Hibler, the Bike Club provides a natural environment for meeting new people.

Fellow club vice president John Hibler, who encountered Klempert on Oil Well Road three years ago, shared his perspective on the community and the club. "It's a very warm, welcoming community," said Hibler.

Describing it as a place where friendships easily form, he emphasized the camaraderie within the club, stating that making friends there is more natural than in a golf setting. "You just meet more people on the bike,"

Hibler said.

Hibler, a retired dermatologist, eagerly anticipates returning to Ave Maria from chilly Ohio, looking forward to the warmth, bicycle rides and the community. The Ave Maria Bike Club, as Tom Nuttle emphasizes, is about supporting each other on the roads of town.

Nuttle, the current vice president, expressed his gratitude for founding the club and acknowledged Klempert's role in its growth. "I'm really glad I found Phil," Nuttle

Despite being smaller than some Ave Maria organizations, the Bike Club boasts an estimated 35-to-38 members, reflecting the community's interest in activities beyond traditional sports.

"We try to get as many members as we can to go out," Klempert said. "We'll maintain a steady pace like 10 or 11 miles an hour so that we can all talk." Stronger riders can reach speeds of up to 22 or 23 miles per hour.

Under Klempert's leadership, the club extends its focus beyond riding. Plans include a benefit cancer ride in February for the Sylvester Cancer Center, covering 39 miles and open to riders of various ages and skill levels. Klempert's weekly routine involves individual rides on Tuesdays and Thursdays and group rides on other days, exploring Ave Maria and occasionally venturing onto Oil Well Road.

Winterfest are straightforward.

The January event isn't confined to Ave Maria or Southwest Florida; it aims to attract participants from other states as well.

"We're hoping to bring people in from other states," Phyllis, 65, said, with an anticipated turnout of about 200 participants.

The original plan for the event called for an October timeframe, but considering that snowbirds typically arrive in January, the decision was made to maximize player and spectator attendance with a winter event.

The Winterfest will offer different age divisions and skill levels, with age divisions ranging from 20-to-49, 50-to-65, and 66-plus.

The fact that the event will be in a 55-plus community doesn't limit who can participate or watch.

"We didn't want to limit it to adults 55 and over," Bill said.

An Anthem Parkway Extension is Coming

As the fastest-growing community in Southwest Florida and one of the top-selling master-planned communities in the United States, Ave Maria is actively adding new neighborhoods, commercial space and recreational amenities. With this growth comes the need for added infrastructure.

In November, construction began on Anthem Parkway (Phase 5A), involving two roadway extensions near North Park and the Water Park at the intersection of Ave Maria Boulevard and Anthem Parkway. This added infrastructure prepares the area for growth in the next few years, including the addition of a public school. No significant traffic disruptions are expected with this work, which is estimated to take about a year to complete.

While work on both roadway extensions will occur simultaneously, it is anticipated that an 850-foot northbound extension of Ave Maria Boulevard will be completed first to provide direct access to North Park. Workers will then complete the 3,600-foot extension of Anthem Parkway from the intersection at Ave Maria Boulevard moving eastward and ending with a roundabout that will connect to Hudson Way, in Avalon Park. It will include two lanes in each direction.

This roadway project will alter the access configuration to both North Park and the Water Park. Notably, the current northbound left-in access from Anthem Parkway to North Park will be eliminated, with direct access from the south to be replaced by the previously mentioned Ave Maria Boulevard extension, which will connect to the North Park's northwest access point.

Twelve-foot, asphalt multi-use pathways running parallel to Anthem Parkway and Ave Maria Boulevard extensions will also be installed for pedestrians, bicyclists and golf carts, along with the lush landscaping that Ave Maria residents have come to expect and enjoy.

Phase 5A will provide access to the future Ave Maria Elementary school on the north side of Anthem Parkway from land currently owned by Collier County Public Schools, and also offer full connectivity to another, yet-to-

be-permitted extension of Anthem Parkway called Phase 5B, which would continue the parkway to Pope John Paul II Boulevard and provide additional access to the northern, as-yet-undeveloped areas of Ave Maria.

According to Dan Hartley, vice president of engineering for Peninsula Engineering, "During construction, maintenance of traffic will be adjusted as needed, based on construction sequencing by the contractor. Those details have not been finalized at this time, but this is in an area of Ave Maria that does not have any through traffic, and access will be maintained to the existing parks, other than during potential short-term closures to

complete the required improvements. I don't anticipate any long-term closures to existing roadways. Appropriate maintenance of traffic will be provided during the construction activities."

Peninsula Engineering obtained county permitting for Phase 5A and will continue to be involved throughout construction, inspecting the work for conformance to the design plans. As the construction project manager for Ave Maria Stewardship Community District (AMSCD), Peninsula Engineering will also assist the district engineer, Agnoli Barber and Brundage, in construction

"The community is growing in leaps and bounds," said Sal D'Angelo, director of operations for AMSCD. "My understanding is that by fall of 2026, the elementary school will be open, and at some point in the future, a public middle school, and they are going to be part of this growth and expansion for Anthem Parkway. It's exciting! I know 5A is what they're going to be working on first, and then that 5B component. Once they complete all that, then it becomes part of the district's inventory for operations and maintenance and upkeep, which is my world. More growth is coming. Stay tuned."

Emma Schweitzer Becomes First National Player of the Week in Ave Maria's Soccer Program History

Ave Maria University goalkeeper Emma Schweitzer excels in her element when opponents approach, poised to unleash shots at the net. Far from being intimidated, she revels in the pressure.

"I love the fearless aspect," Schweitzer recently remarked. "I love diving. Not only that, I like being the leader on the field."

The world of NAIA women's soccer is becoming acquainted with Emma Schweitzer, a Tampa Catholic High School graduate who made her move to campus in early August.

Two months into her journey at Ave Maria, Schweitzer earned recognition as the NAIA National Defensive Player of the Week for her outstanding performance against perennial powerhouse Keiser University on Sept. 27.

Keiser, a two-time national champion ranked No. 11 in the nation, had never suffered a loss or tie against the Gryenes. Schweitzer, with 14 remarkable saves, played a pivotal role in securing the Gyrenes' first tie against the Sun Conference rival.

"I just remember on the sidelines jaws dropped to the floor and gasping," said senior teammate Gabby Decker. "We wanted to run on the field but couldn't. It was really exciting. Hard to put into words."

The honor deeply touched Schweitzer. "I was very joyful," she expressed. "I was very appreciative of the award."

Schweitzer made history as the first member of Ave Maria's soccer program to win a national player of the week award.

The tied match earned a crucial point in the conference standings, propelling the Gyrenes into the Sun Conference playoffs for the first time in three years, according to Coach Tyler Rosser.

The coaching staff consider themselves fortunate to have a goalkeeper of Schweitzer's caliber, inheriting the position from the accomplished Maddie Samuelson. Beyond athletic prowess, they sought a player with character and dedication.

"It's like finding a needle in a haystack to find a really dedicated player who could pick up and build on what Maddie did," Rosser said.

Then came an email from Schweitzer. "We could just tell from her email how dedicated she is," Rosser recalled. In the email, Schweitzer expressed her genuine desire to come to Ave Maria and play soccer.

Upon reviewing Schweitzer's playing style, captured in film, and a subsequent visit a couple of months later, the coaching staff knew she was the keeper they would rely on for the next three years.

The coaching staff remains impressed not only by Schweitzer's saves but also by her joy and leadership off the field. "She spreads that

to everyone she meets," Rosser added.

Thalia Meza, assistant coach, noted Schweitzer's attentiveness and dedication during warm-ups, practices, and interactions with coaches. Since her arrival, Schweitzer has continued to improve under the guidance of goalkeeping coach Eddie Villarreal.

Beyond the field, Schweitzer maintains a close connection with her parents, Craig and Linda. Her first call after receiving the news about the national player of the week award was to her mom.

A critical element in the team's transition to a freshman goalkeeper, according to Meza, is the grace displayed by senior goalkeeper Ariana Dale. "She's been really wonderful," Meza said. "You can imagine being a senior and then a freshman coming and doing all this, and she's just been so humble. I think you can imagine the opposite happening, being resentful and jealous."

Not with the Gyrenes.

Emma Schweitzer has truly earned glowing accolades. "Probably one in a million in terms of what we're looking for as a keeper," Rosser said.

And she's only a freshman.
