





The brainchild of Biz Kidz, JD Ribali, evolved from a program that stagnated at his wife Kristin's workplace. Her nonprofit had been helping a Boy Scout earn his Entrepreneur Badge. When the nonprofit could no longer support the endeavor, JD and Kristina broadened the idea and reimagined the program. Through the years it has grown more expansive and is continuing to reach new heights.

"We just got our 5013c nonprofit declaration a few weeks ago," said Ribali. "This will allow us to apply for grants and other funding sources. For the past two years we have been operating only on generous community sponsorship and support from other small businesses in Southwest Florida."

School-aged children can attend Biz Kidz camps which consist of corporation themed field trips, to local companies to witness daily operations, or a special guest visit where company managers evaluate the children's ideas and offer real life suggestions and participate in the creation of kid's products. "Members of the local business community will act as mentors to these children and encourage them to pursue production of their ideas," said Ribali.

At the Biz Kidz Expo, row after row of crafted items conceptualized and made by the kids are put up for sale. Children have the chance to follow their ideas from first thought to fabrication to profit. And speaking of profit, the average child makes \$250 a day at these events.

That sure beats a paper route!

Also at the Expo, prizes are offered for the most successful business plans. This is in addition to the profits kids make when selling their wares. Just ask Lisa Lyman. Her daughter Ella holds the record

as the highest single day earner so far at \$1000. "She's the most down to earth young lady. And just so full of drive and motivation to see her business succeed," said Lyman.

The business idea came to 11-year-old Ella one day while walking her beloved dog, Chicky. Holding the leash with one hand, she was unable to text her mom about her route

and ETA. She needed a third hand. What to do, what to do? "My dog leashes are adjustable crossbody dog leashes so you can walk your dog hands free," said Ella. "I created my product early in 2023 and started doing Biz Kidz that April."

A video on the Biz Kidz Facebook page shows the colorful yarn creations that free up hands for texting, talking or picking up those certain things that we all know are part of walking your dog.

"I have so much fun doing the markets, expos and trips that Biz Kidz offers. I have learned so

much. Ella noted. "I have gotten the opportunity to improve myself and my product, as well as my people skills."

Even stellar sales like Ella's aren't the only motivator with Biz Kidz members. A grand prize of \$5,000 is also awarded at the Expo to encourage children to continue pursuing their dreams. The Biz Kidz frog logo seen

on their branding was designed by a former member who now draws for Nickelodeon's SpongeBob SquarePants.

That logo will be front and center when a new weekly Zoom meeting soon launches, offering a place for kids to ask questions, share ideas and brainstorm. "My kids all worked for our family business, and they saw first-hand what goes into running a company and keeping your product viable," said Ribali. "They also learned that failure is part of business. Our Zoom meeting and other events let kids learn that you need to be adaptable to succeed."

Ave Maria residents will have a chance to witness the excitement of this program and these youngsters when they visit the community at this winter's signature events such as Taste of Ave and the Blues, Brews & BBQ Festival. If the response at last autumn's Fall Festival is any indication, the kids will be warmly received. Their Joyful Lemonde product raked in \$700. There's nothing sour about that!

In addition to dog leash inventor Ella, Ribali proudly mentions other notable ideas. At a recent event at Miromar Outlets, one high schooler sold out of his product. "You know those shoe charms that kids love to put on Crocs?" he asked. "This boy devised a lock for the charms, so they won't fall off or get stolen." His product now has a patent pending

"Another one of my favorites would go to Goodwill and buy old broken toys," Ribali continued. "He would isolate needed components and then visit the thrift store's electronics section. He would take apart circuit boards from different devices and combine them with the toy parts to build his own robots!"

Clearly, we should keep our eyes out for Biz Kidz members on Shark Tank in the future. As Ella summed it up, "I want to put in a good word for Biz Kidz and how much I truly enjoy it. I always look forward to my next market!" After she walks Chicky, of course.

Ave Maria Little League Hits It Out of the Park for Youth Development

New Year's Day is often associated with college football bowl games. But on New Year's Day 2024, Little League softball and baseball were the sports of most importance at South Park in Ave Maria.

A handful of softball players were practicing informally on that spectacularly sunny day under the watchful eye of coaches and parents. A baseball coach was also at the park to talk about Ave Maria Little League.

Whether college football or adult pickleball or golf, a fundamental appeal of sports is camaraderie.

That is a theme 12-year-old pitcher and team captain Ireland McDaniel addressed as she sat at a picnic table with her parents.

What does the sixth grader like about playing softball?

"Just how you make friends really easily," Ireland said. "They perfect your imperfections."

As Ireland spoke, her parents, Shannon and Steve, listened intently. In the fall program, Ireland pitched nine hitless innings.

"I live vicariously through her," Shannon said.

The softball team's name is the Ave Maria Angels.

"Aptly named, right?" Manager Joe Asencio said.

He has two daughters on the team, Harlow, 12, and Lena, 10.

The young Ave Maria Little League baseball and softball teams programs are growing.

The boys 9-11 age group baseball team won the 2022 District 18 championship. That means they beat the older and more established programs from Naples and Golden Gate. That earned them a trip to the sectional tournament and the opportunity to play teams from beyond this corner of Southwest Florida, eventually losing to Venice in the title game.

As the community grows, so does the Little League program. Asencio said when he took over the program was in "disarray."

"The girls couldn't win," Asencio said. "And I mean not close. Not even competitive."

He said the team was losing games 20-0 and even worse.

"They were getting hammered," Asencio said.

The team was losing to more established programs such as those in La-Belle, Naples, Fort Myers, Golden Gate and Immokalee. Asencio wasn't sure of the precise record in 2023 but thinks it was 8-5. The days of getting hammered appear to be over.

In the fall season the Angels were 4-0. "We're trying to build here from scratch," said Asencio, a military veteran with three years active service in the Army and six years in the Air Force Reserve. The discipline and attention to detail honed through all those years of military service is now part of what he brings to Little League softball and more.

"I try to bring good attitudes and that hard work ethic," Asencio said. "Give it your all."

Giving your all means practicing even on holidays such as New Year's Day. Ireland McDaniel was one of those players working out on the holiday. She was honing her pitching talent.

Ireland has big dreams that include someday playing in an elite collegiate program such as those at the University of Alabama or University of Oklahoma or Louisiana State.



For now, the focus is Little League and making the Angels better. She hopes to see more girls come out to make that short-term dream a reality.

"If they commit to playing softball and want to get better at it, I feel the team is going to be really good," Ireland said

Ireland McDaniel is, according to Asencio, the key to the team's success.

"I don't know how well we would do without her," Asencio said. "She sets an example for the rest of the girls."

Ireland is two years older than Lena Asencio, who has been inspired by the older girl's talent and work ethic.

"She's a pitcher now, too, because of her," Asencio said.

As Ave Maria grows and more families move into the community, more youngsters will likely sign up to play baseball and softball. Asencio recalls what he saw on the final day of the fall season at South Park.

"Literally 20 minutes before the game starts, I look out and I see a father with a daughter practicing," Asencio said. "Who's this? I went to go talk with him."

The daughter was signed up, growing the team's roster.

"She's going to be on the team," Asen-

cio said.

The baseball program is also growing and improving. Ariel Hernandez, the league's public information officer, pointed to the boys winning the 2022 district title against larger leagues as an example. Other leagues are so large that they select all-star teams from multiple teams to compete in tournament play. Not so in Ave Maria.

"So, my in-house team was my all star team," Hernandez said.

The boys' program, which also includes two tee-ball teams, has about 90 to 100 participants. Given the dynamic nature of the community's growth, Little League officials expect it to grow even

"We're getting a lot of requests on social media," Hernandez said.

Little League coach Chris Luther is in his third season coaching baseball in Ave Maria. His son, Jameson, who turns 9 soon, is on the team and has progressed each season. Jameson started in T-ball, then moved up to coach-pitch and the catcher is now in player-pitch as a catcher. His favorite player is Miami Marlins center fielder Jazz Chisholm Jr.

His father has coached him at each level

"I try to bring good attitudes and that hard work ethic. Give it your all."

"We're now moving up through the ranks together," Chris Luther said.

One of the rewards of coaching for Mr. Luther is seeing the progress his players make in all facets of the game. Even over periods as brief as two or three months he sees improvement.

Baseball or a variation of it is a big part of life for the Luther Family. If Jameson and his dad are not at the park playing baseball, they can be found in the yard playing wiffle ball.

"All the time," Mr. Luther said.

League umpire-in-chief Jeremy Breitag has been around the league longer than the Luthers. He has been in Ave Maria for six years. When he and his wife and family moved into their Maple Ridge home six years ago, they lived in the only house on their street. Now that street is filled.

"It's all built out," he said.

He's helping to build Ave Maria Little League. He wants the league to be about more than winning and losing.

"I want to make sure we just don't teach these kids baseball and softball," he said. "That they grow up to be great humans, just great adults. I always say baseball and sports in general provide discipline, a lot of life lessons."

the town's establishment in 2007. Its ranking for 2023 is a boost from the previous year's position at 18th place with 586 home sales. According to Mambuca, 2024 sales are expected to be brisk, as well, with conservative estimates set at more than 500 new home closings.

"Ave Maria is growing very rapidly due to the lifestyle we offer and the price point of new homes," Mambuca asserted. "We offer different types of homes to fit a price that you like. Whether it's growing families, mature families, golf enthusiasts or active adults, there's something for everyone, for every budget, which is why Ave Maria's master plan is so popular."

The community has four builders—CC Homes, Del Webb Naples, Lennar and Pulte Homes-offering more than 25 fully decorated model homes available to tour. Prices range from the high \$200s to \$800s, and the average home price is in the \$400s.

"From underground utilities to reliable water service and amazing parks and recreation settings, everything about the town is very well planned out, and also very well maintained with a board that helps make decisions in the best interest of residents," remarked Mambuca.

Another plus is Ave Maria's rich sense of community. The Ave Maria Master Association (AMMA) puts together events for residents throughout the year, and within most neighborhoods there is a lifestyle director that also plans functions for their residents. playgrounds and rustic settings in several public parks; an ever-evolving Town Center with retail and dining options; and meticulously landscaped biking and walking paths. As a Blue Zone certified community, Ave Maria offers scores of opportunities to maintain an active, engaged life, featuring meaningful encounters with nature, family, friends and neighbors.

"People that move here are looking for more; they're looking to get to know their neighbors, enjoy fun events and have convenient services nearby, from healthcare to beauty services to dining options," Mambuca said, adding that this is precisely what Ave Maria offers. "People come from all over Florida and the nation looking for a convenient, peaceful life. They don't want to drive far to get what they need. They want to have that sense of community. They're looking for the lifestyle, and then they can find a home that fits their budget for their family. What more do you need?"

Thoughtful planning also goes into the scale and type of growth. As new neighbors move in, greater amenities are worked into the master plan. "As much as we are developers, we're responsible developers," Mambuca said. "We communicate with residents; we listen to their input. There's a lot of thought that goes into the decisions that we make, always wanting to benefit the community and encouraging more people to want to move here."

Following Hurricane Ian, Los Adolescentes came together and hosted a bake sale in the Town Center, collecting all proceeds for storm relief. The club meets weekly for games, volunteer initiatives and group-building activities.

"We've always been an active family involved in community engagements and non-profits, PTA meetings, work events and relief efforts, and that did not change once we moved here," said Martinez.

Any Town Center events, festivities organized by the master association or town businesses, Sandy is sure to promote on her personal social media and group pages – all with thousands of followers – who engage with her content and later share participation photos.

"I've been following Sandy's activity updates on social media since 2019, and she unknowingly helped me connect with other residents my age. One of my friend groups follows her page for an event insider into Ave Maria," said resident Audrey Grossman, 25.

Her first clubhouse event she organized, there was a capacity of 20 and triple the number of participants arrived. Every community event since has been at full-capacity and Sandy can't help but do a silent happy dance for how well received gatherings have been.

The household name is now a favorite for clubhouse events.

'This Thanksgiving, we arranged a pie potluck. There were dozens upon dozens of pies and over one hundred CC Homes residents who stopped by for a slice... For something as simple as a slice of pie and there being that significant of a turnout, all I can say is wow!" Sandy chuckled out.

A few years into living in Ave Maria, Sandy never expected she would fall ill with several rare immunocompromised diseases. When Maple Ridge residents learned of the devastating news, they did not hesitate to step up and offer help. Neighbors took shifts cooking and cleaning. They drove Martinez to appointments and formed a support system for her daughters.

When readapting to increased mobility, Sandy praises local boutiques Hoja de Menta and The Secret Ingredient for one-on-one customer sessions where she could browse at her pace, try on clothes which accommodated her restrictions and not feel self-conscious of the physical implications her disease created.

'Selflessness is something hard to come by these days," Martinez said. "Every time I tell my story I try to say it without crying. The overwhelming gratefulness I have for this community is something I will always carry with me. Before I became ill, I was involved and wanted to support Ave Maria in any way



having their stores open after-hours for I could. I wanted to show off this town, and I still do," she added. "All the support I gave my community came back in triple, even quadruple!"

Kind efforts revive any weakened sprit or curious mind, and Maple Ridge's Lifestyle Director aims to continue this commitment for all community members wanting to experience the big fun, small town life.

Being a catalyst for friendship-making and memories, Sandy has been a landmark for people who live in the CC Homes communities and other parts of Town, and she looks forward to meeting whomever walks into her clubhouse where she can introduce the fun that happens when you become part of Ave Maria. 💒



Diamond Siblings:

How Ave Maria University's McCormick Brothers Redefined Baseball

The Ave Maria University baseball program is a brotherhood in more ways than one.

Its current and most recent head coaches are brothers. Nicholas McCormick, 28, was recently promoted from associate head coach to head coach replacing his older brother, Michael. Michael, 30, a former pitcher in the Chicago White Sox organization, accepted a job with the Boston Red Sox as a minor-league pitching coach.

On a recent overcast morning between Christmas and New Year's Day they discussed their baseball journeys and how they helped build the Gyrenes baseball program.

Michael is the only head coach in program history with a winning record, 79-75-1. He did it with his younger brother by his side as an assistant, hitting instructor and third base coach during games.

Now, still in his 20s, Nicholas is a college head coach.

"What I always wanted to do," Nicholas said, sitting in his office across the street from the baseball field. "Even when I was in high school and I was playing, I always knew that this was the route I wanted to take career-wise. Being a college head coach."

He fine-tuned his coaching philosophy over the past three years alongside Michael. They were teammates at Speedway High School in Indiana where the sports teams are called the Sparkplugs. They were also teammates at Eastern Illinois University.

The past three seasons they guided the Gyrenes. What did Nicholas learn about being a head coach from his big brother?

"How not to do it," Michael jokingly said and laughed.

Nicholas, of course, realized his brother was joshing. What did Nicholas learn about being a head coach from his brother?

"A lot," Nicholas said. "I'd say the biggest piece is the relationship aspect. That is a big part of this business. Always make sure to prioritize that and just generally speaking, how to manage people better from a leadership perspective."

In 2023, the Gyrenes finished second in the Sun Conference and earned their first postseason appearance in a decade, winning two games in a regional in Hattiesburg, Mississippi. Five players were named second-team All-Conference.

The university appreciates what the brothers accomplished. In a November news release announcing the changes, it was noted that Michael was moving on "after elevating the program to national prominence during his tenure."

The program went on from 16 wins in 2021 to 36 wins in 2023.

Now, in 2024, they hope to do even better.

Outfielder Francisco Barbieri has been part of the transformation and is in his third year in the program.

The Canadian was recruited by Ave

"It's a hard sell for a team that doesn't win," Barbieri said in a telephone interview from his Brampton, Ontario home.

The Gyrenes posted eight consecutive losing records, from 2014 to 2021. But the McCormicks impressed Barbieri.

"They were honest," Barbieri said.

Barbieri was impressed enough to

ever made," said Barbieri, who is a junior athletically and a senior academically.

In the fall he and the rest of the team learned that their head coach was leaving to join the Red Sox organization.

"That was a bittersweet moment," Barbieri said.

He was happy for Michael and then happy to learn Nicholas would become head coach.

"The team wanted that," Barbieri said. The McCormicks approach coaching in similar fashions. They know coaching is about more than making out line-up cards and tweaking swings and fine-tuning a pitcher's windup. It's a people business.

"Just always have an open-door policy," Nicholas said. "Use baseball as a platform to build relationships."

The brothers also built the program. In the first 11 seasons of Ave Maria baseball, the team had one winning season. That was in 2013 when the Gyrenes were 38-21. That was also the last time the Gyrenes had advanced to an NAIA regional.

In Michael's first season the team was

8-20. But in 2022 the Gyrenes were 27-25-1 and last year they were 36-18.

To get even better requires recruiting. Recruiting is the lifeblood of collegiate sports programs. How do they recruit students and athletes such as Barbieri to Ave Maria?

"Ave Maria University is a very niche school," Michael said. "For us, the baseball piece is kind of the last thing we look for. The first two being the spiritual standpoint and then they have to sustain the grades to be eligible. The last thing we look at is the baseball side."

The baseball side is what compelled the Red Sox to hire Michael as a coach. He will be working with young players mostly the same age as the Gyrenes, players just starting pro careers.

Although he will be working with players getting paid to play, the basics of coaching will remain the same for Michael.

"I'm taking the same approach," he said. "Just invest in the human being first."

The McCormicks have carved out lives for their families in Southwest

Florida, a long way from Speedway. Michael's wife, Teigan, is the Ave Maria head volleyball coach.

The McCormick brothers' parents, Marcus and Kelley, have purchased a home in Naples. Their grandmother also now has a Naples condo.

The Gyrenes are ranked No. 15 in the pre-season national poll, making it their highest ranking ever for the program. "With that obviously comes a lot of expectations, especially based off last year, one of the best seasons in program history," Nicholas said. Now, they hope to build on that success.

"The goal is to get back to a regional," Nicholas said. "Taking the next step to get to the World Series."

Most of the 2023 team returns. That returning core has the experience and confidence that might make those goals a reality.

The season opens Feb. 1 at Arizona Christian, which is Nicholas' alma mater.

Practice began on Jan. 8, which was also the first day of the spring semester. The message from the new head coach was simple.

"Just a continuation of what we said before we left for break, and announced Michael is joining the Red Sox" Nicholas said. "Reiteration of taking it one day at a time. Make sure we stay rooted in the moment and don't get too far ahead of ourselves. There's going to be ups and downs throughout the course of the season"

But based on what was achieved in 2023 and a strong returning core of players, optimism is high.

"The guys are fired up for the season," Nicholas said.

The current seniors endured lean years early in their collegiate careers. Nicholas said at least half of the starters are either seniors or students already in graduate school.

Those players will go into the season with a sense of continuity. Although their head coach is gone, their former associate head coach is now in charge.

"With me taking over, none of that changes, which is great for the guys," Nicholas said. "They can feel comfortable knowing that everything they've become accustomed to and enjoyed for the past few years, it all stays the same. Nothing changes."

Expectations are high. The players know that being ranked No. 15 speaks volume.

"It says a lot about where the program has come from," Barbieri said.

They know where they will be in early May.

The baseball worlds of Michael and Nicholas should collide in May. The Sun Conference tournament will be held May 2-5 at JetBlue Park, where the older brother will be coaching. The Gyrenes don't want the 2024 season to end in a regional tournament as it did last year.

"We have the team to win the national championship," Barbieri said.

The conference tournament offers an uncanny coincidence. In some ways, the distance from college baseball to the pros is vast.

But geographically for Michael it won't be too far. JetBlue is 34.6 miles away from Ave Maria University, according to Google Maps.

He may be moving on, but Michael still uses the word "we" when discussing the Gyrenes.

"I'll always be a Gyrene," Michael

Entrepreneurial Couple Thriving in Ave Maria

About 20 percent of American workers earn their living from home, according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, and at Ave Maria, you'll find a number of residence-based entrepreneurs. Take for example, Winston Thomas and Nicole Ricca.

Since 2018, the couple has lived with their three school-age kids in a five-bedroom, single-family home at Maple Ridge Reserve. Thomas, a Grammy Award-winning music producer and world-traveling DJ, converted one of their three garage bays into a production studio. Ricca commandeered a bedroom to sew and handcraft children's props and fancy outfits for private clients, including celebrities like Kevin Hart. Her business is called Willow Mint Props (willowmintprops.com).

Winston Thomas's **Music Career**

"I feel blessed that I'm able to make money off of what I love to do, which is music," Thomas said, adding that he has DJ-ed around the globe, including in Thailand, Japan, India, Dubai, Singapore, the Caribbean and Latin America. DJ BlackOut, as he's known, began spinning records in Long Island, where he grew up, following in his father's footsteps who DJed for a living.

Although Thomas managed to get a few jobs at dance clubs in Manhattan later the kids, sealed the deal, as they all and Queens, it was a visit to Miami that changed his life. On his first night at a club on South Beach, Thomas found himself sitting in the VIP lounge next to Britney Spears and Justin Timberlake. Right then and there, he decided to move to Miami, where he garnered multiple gigs at dance clubs around town, hobnobbed with recording artists and music managers, and booked jobs producing music.

In a career that spans 20 years, Thomas took home a Latin Grammy for his collaboration with Puerto Rican rapper and singer-songwriter Don Omar, won two Billboard awards for his production of Nicki Minaj's second album, "Roman Holiday," and produced the number-one hit on the U.S. Billboard Hot 100 chart, "This Is Why I'm Hot," by American rapper MIMS. He has worked with mega-stars Pitbull and Flo Rida, and also helped develop the talents of Jason Derulo, a pop and R&B singer-songwriter with multiple platinum singles.

Meeting Nicole Ricca

Miami was also where Thomas met Nicole Ricca. "The artists that I was working with made music videos, and at the time in 2002, Nicole was one of the top models in those videos," Thomas recalled. "I developed a crush on her before we even met. I remember seeing her on MTV and saying, 'Wow, that's going to be my wife,' but I was just dreaming, because I'm sure every guy that watched those videos was thinking the same thing. I didn't think I would even meet her." Now, all these years later, the couple has three children: Nyla, 15, Aspen, 8, and London, 12.

Making the Move to Ave Maria

The family had been living in Pembroke Pines for about 13 years when they made the improbable move to Ave Maria. "We were renting a house for \$3,500, and that money was just going out the window because we didn't own anything, so we were definitely looking to buy somewhere, and my best friend, Pierre Malette, an accountant, was doing taxes for somebody that lived in Ave Maria, so he kind of kidnapped me one day and took me out there to check it out," Thomas recounted. Although he wasn't looking to move to the west coast of Florida, Thomas fell in love with Ave Maria after one short visit and subsequently brought his wife over to take a tour with him. The visit by Ricca, and fell in love with the town.

Finding a Sense of Security

"The first time our Pembroke Pines neighbors spoke to us was when they saw us moving out," Thomas quips. "In Ave, all of our neighbors were really friendly right away. Our next-door neighbor cooked us dinner, which might be a regular thing out here, but it was so weird for us, and we loved it. The kids made new friends right away."

Thomas also remembers seeing unlocked bikes scattered on a street corner in Maple Ridge and was delighted to learn that school kids cycled to this bus stop in the morning, left their bikes there all day while they attended classes and after school rode their bikes back home. "That blew my mind, because if you leave your bike like that in New York, it's gone by the end of the day," Thomas pointed out. "I knew this was exactly where I wanted my kids to grow up."

The family loves the sense of safety

they feel in Ave Maria. "At the Fall Festi- ic strip. We want it to be by people that val or Hometown Christmas or any other event in town, we allow our kids to run around, and we would never do that in Pembroke Pines," Thomas attests. "We feel safe. We know a lot of people in the neighborhood, and they know us. People actually look out for our kids."

Last November, the couple launched Everything Ave Maria, a monthly printed magazine mailed to every home in town. The idea came from Thomas' conversations with local business owners Danee' Williams, of Oil Well Craft Beer, Phong Ho, of OASIS The Kitchen Lounge, and Jorge Arroyo, of Mercato at Ave, who were looking for a centralized means to publicize events and special promotions.

Thomas explains, "Our magazine promotes a little bit of everything. It's pretty much coupons, a business directory, events, crossword puzzles, write-ups of business owners or just people in Ave. We're also working on an Ave Maria com-

live in Ave Maria, about people in Ave, for businesses in Ave." For the time being, he is investing sweat equity in their venture, taking photographs, designing graphics and laying out the magazine himself, and contracting a local writer and photographer for some of the content.

"We want Everything Ave Maria to become an important publication, and we're excited about the future. We're only 4,600 homes now, but we're slated to be 11,000 homes. That's a lot of people," Thomas notes. "Not only did my wife and I fall in love with everything about the townhow family-oriented it is and how we could afford to buy a new house that was built just for us—but as entrepreneurs, we see this as a place of a lot of opportunity, because it's new, and if you get yourself into something early, by the time it's done, you're going to be in a good position."
