Community Compassion: Serafina's Wish Fulfilled in Ave Maria

Serafina Feger was two years old when she was diagnosed with Neurofibromatosis Type 1 (NF1), a defect on the 17th chromosome that affects the body's production of nerve fibromas and causes tumors to form in the brain, spinal cord and nerves.

The diagnosis came after Serafina began experiencing a progression of weakness and pain, specifically on the right side of her body. Following a series of neurological tests and scans, it was revealed that Serafina had a low-grade Glioma infiltrating her spinal cord, brainstem and cerebellum.

The uncertainty of the situation was what troubled parents Elizabeth and Brett Feger. NF1 traditionally appears as a gene that is passed down from parent to child; in Serafina's case, it spontaneously developed as a de novo mutation. Additionally, the diffused nature of Serafina's brain tumor made it difficult to predict how it would affect her lifestyle.

"It was certainly shocking. You kind of go through that whole array of thoughts like, she could have all these things happen to her and there's a chance that she's going to suffer tremendously. You just don't know," Elizabeth said. "That's the thing about NF1. They can live an absolutely next-to-normal life with very little symptoms, or they could experience very severe symptoms."


The Ave Maria Civic Association Unites Residents for Community Solutions

Commercial trucks and tractor trailers were crowding a peaceful residential neighborhood. Homeowners were frustrated and baffled to know where to turn for information. This is exactly the kind of neighborhood quandary which precipitated the need for the soon to be unveiled Ave Maria Civic Association.

Collier County Commissioner Bill McDaniel plans to establish a Civic Asso-



after residents confronted community problems and were unsure who to talk to. At the January town hall meeting, the plan was set. As McDaniel explained, 'We needed a way for

the community to feel they have access to governance, to get answers to questions affecting their subdivisions."

Five residents who attended January's town hall volunteered to lay the groundwork for organizing the group. By late March they will announce the official start date, appoint officers and set up the meeting schedule.

Civic associations play a distinctive and vital role in a democratic society, developing core virtues and values that enable individuals to contribute to public life and maintain the political institutions of a free society. When the young French



philosopher Alexis de Tocqueville visited the United States in the early 1800s, he observed that democracy in America had been especially strengthened by broad participation in a wide range of civic associations, including clubs, churches, nonprofits and community groups of all types.

"As Ave Maria continues to grow, there is a need for the community to have a voice," McDaniel said. There are numerous subdivisions and often there is no way to communicate between one subdivision and another." The Civic Association will highlight those issues that affect all the neighborhoods as well as the town of Ave Maria as a whole. "This way communities can come together and know where to turn with questions," McDaniel explained.

Large features like the hospital facili-

ties, commercial entities, schools, roads, water park and playgrounds are overseen by the Ave Maria Stewardship and town developer, Barron Collier Companies. But Ave Maria's subdivisions will now have a uniting body to discuss residential day-today concerns. McDaniel shared. "This will prevent feelings of fragmentation between the HOAs and separate neighborhoods. It is an alternative method to communicating with the government."

The goal of the Civic Association will be to act as an umbrella group for united discussions of community issues. It is the necessary mid-point for a community of this size which is not yet "at the incorporating or municipality stage but has reached a point where a mechanism is needed to answer the needs that are cropping up," McDaniel concluded. 🏒





Donahue Academy's Fundraising Drive for Growth

Donahue Academy, Ave Maria Parish's private catholic school, has begun a fundraising initiative to accommodate its growing student body. The endeavor aims to fund the installation of modular classroom units, granting the school the ability to increase enrollment opportunities.

Over the years, Donahue Academy has garnered a local reputation for its' exceptional educational performance. The local school boasts a 100% college acceptance rate, with 75% of those students pursuing their post-secondary education at catholic institutions. This year, it has also been named amongst the highest-scoring private schools in Florida for the SAT.

As a result, Donahue Academy has faced growing demand from community members interested in enrolling their children. The school's enrollment exceeds 400 students, spanning from preschoolers to high school seniors, with an additional waitlist of over 200 prospective students.

Principal Marc Snyder believes the addition of modular classroom units will help alleviate this demand, allowing more families to access faith-based education.

"Many are deserving of a Catholic education but are not able to come here because we just

don't have the space," Snyder said. "Being able to raise funds to add classrooms will allow us to bring in more students."

The initiative is being spearheaded by the Academy's advancement director, Brigid Luzarraga, with the assistance of Snyder. While the venture is considered in its beginning stages, with financial support garnered through internal efforts,

Donahue Academy is starting a more longterm solution to help fund its expansion.

"We are currently working on our future growth plans for the school, which will consist of several different phases. Currently, we're raising money towards the first phase

of our growth, which would be the modular classroom unit," Snyder shared. "We're raising money right now just by asking

our families to help contribute towards our growth. We're asking them to donate money to what we're calling the 'Donahue Fund, which essentially, is going to be a long-term, annual fund."

Snyder emphasizes the importance of supporting organizations that are considered essential in the formation of faith and education in the community.

"We are a premier Catholic, classical school. Not only in the state of Florida, but in the nation. And I think, you know, supporting what we're doing, supporting our mission, is a larger attempt to amplify and spread this kind of education, Catholic classical education, throughout the country."

Swinging Joy on the Green: The Golfing Odyssey of Ave Maria's Jorge Pino

Amidst the rolling green fairways and the towering cypress trees of Panther Run and The National – two of Southwest Florida's most popular golf courses to play – resides an Ave Maria resident who found his golf paradise and community in Ave Maria. Del Webb Naples homeowner Jorge Pino, led a Miami-based law enforcement career for 32 years and after retiring, was looking for his piece of paradise.

After hearing about Ave Maria, he and his wife made the visit and moved into their home six months later. "I knew it was meant to be when we drove the town's main boulevard for the first time," he said.

Once settled in, it was not long until Jorge started back up his golfing routine... No matter where you reside in town, residents can participate in the recreational lifestyle ranging from all-inclusive clubhouses, the parks and more than 100 miles of walking and biking paths.

He enjoys playing both courses – 18hole Gordon Lewis-designed and open for public play – sometimes on the same day! When referring to the proximal convenience, Jorge noted residents use their golf carts for just about everything. "We go from our homes to Publix, back to home, then to the courses... It's a friendly community."

Jorge is the club champion at Panther Run located in the community where he

lives. When he isn't playing over there, he tees it up at The National Golf & Country Club minutes from his home. "It's wonderful for an avid golfer to have two champi-

onship courses a half-mile from each other," he shared.

Whether he's perfecting his swing or enjoying a casual round with friends, Jorge finds immense satisfaction in the sport and the camaraderie that Ave Maria's golfing scene fosters.

As a certified Blue Zones community, the town makes it easier to live an active and fulfilling lifestyle. Ave Maria adopted Power 9° – nine common principles learned from the Blue Zones longevity hotspots of the world. These principles focus on moving naturally, maintaining a healthy outlook, eating wisely and connection. Jorge utilizes the walking paths,

outdoor recreation, dining options and calendar of events to feel fulfilled by staying active and connecting with his community. There's another community Jorge is a part of, too: he's a cancer survivor.

In 2001, he was unfortunately diagnosed with thyroid cancer, and it made him think about life more, especially about what he was doing with his time. "I was a City of Miami police officer, and I did not want to abandon my chosen profession, but to at least do something a bit friendlier, so I applied to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission and worked in public information for the last 17 years of

my career."

Thankfully, he beat cancer and shares the old saying, 'A bad day on the golf course beats a good day at work,' but Jorge adds to the end, "And every day's a great day at Ave Maria!"

Beyond the recreational amenities, Jorge cherishes the sense of belonging that permeates Ave Maria's tight-knit community. From impromptu gatherings at Del Webb's club house to lively neighborhood barbecues, there's ample opportunities everywhere for residents to forge meaningful connections.

"If you're not from this area, and you're not accustomed to waving at your neighbors when you drive by them, you better learn how to do that quickly when you move to Ave Maria!" he jokes. "Because everyone that is driving by you is going to wave, so this is the Ave Maria wave," he demonstrated with a smile.

some tender loving care. Here's a deep dive into all the improvements:

Fitness Pool

Filled with 297,000 gallons of water, the expansive fitness pool has distinct areas that cater to different forms of recreation, including a four-lane lap pool; an in-water volleyball court; a zero-deck entry for young families; and a spacious swimming area for people to hang out and chat in small groups. Two feet above the surface of the fitness pool, there is a luxurious spa and cascading waterfall that create a resort-style ambiance.

After draining the fitness pool and spa, the surfaces were ground down, resurfaced and repainted white by Naples-based contractor Finishing by Baker. They retiled the water lines with cobalt blue tiles in the recreational area and spa, and with black tiles along the lap lanes. New stainless-steel ladders and handrails were installed, 18 underwater lights were replaced with LED bulbs, the jets in the spa were repaired, and a new, in-water basketball hoop was added. Upgraded landscaping, as well as new umbrellas, tables and chairs, provide added shade and comfort.

"We also installed backstroke flags for patrons that like to swim laps on their back," Powell explains. "When they see the flags, they'll know that the wall is coming, so they won't hit their heads."

Activity Pool

With 99,000 gallons of water, the activity pool includes a two-inch to two-foot-deep children's play area equipped with a rope bridge; steps that lead to a green, spiral slide and two small red slides; and an oversized red

bucket which dumps water every 30 seconds onto a roof, splashing droplets on jubilant little ones. Beyond the shallow play area is a four-foot-deep catch pool at the base of two towering yellow and blue slides that anyone who is over 48 inches tall can enjoy. A wet deck near the kids' pool offers another opportunity to have fun, as jets of water shoot up out of the ground.

The activity pool was completely refurbished. All surfaces, slides and other apparatuses were treated for rust, deep-cleaned and

repainted. The kids' area has a brand-new rope bridge. Safe Slide Restoration, which repaired and restored the park's multiple slides, has serviced some of the largest water parks in North America. A steelworker crew worked on the tower leading up to the big slides, making sure they were all in tip-top shape. For weeks, a crew from Infinite Aqua worked on getting the wet deck up and running. and community service."

The park offers water exercise classes Tuesdays through Saturdays from 9 to 10 a.m. and a progressive swim team for kids looking for a swim-team experience. During spring break in April, Powell will teach an American Red Cross water safety instructor course for individuals to learn how to teach swim lessons. "If there are any college students that want a parttime job during the summer, or even retired adults who want to teach swim lessons part time, we have an abundance of children that are in need of swim lessons, and this course is available to anybody that lives in Ave Maria," she explains. The Ave Maria Water Park is open Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; and Sundays from noon to 5 p.m. Admission is \$5 per resident and \$7 per guest, Monday through Friday; \$7 per resident and \$9 per guest on weekends. Kids aged 2 and under are free, and if they are under 48 inches tall, they are only \$5.







Tom Golisano Field House Transformation Elevates Ave Maria Athletics to Greater Success

A new era recently dawned for Ave Maria University (AMU) Athletics when the gleaming, positively sparkling renovated Tom Golisano Field House opened.

It has more of everything. More room. More seating. More weight rooms. More office spaces. More sparkle and intangibles.

Ave Maria athletic director Joe Patterson believes the upgrades to the 40,000-square foot facility are going to propel the Gyrenes to greater heights.

"I think it goes back to the idea of energy and momentum," said Patterson, who is also head football coach and a university vice president. "It's just a sense that we achieve much more having the facilities in place."

Women's basketball coach Alex Moorehead summed up the significance of the renovated field house.

'We just feel like we're back at home," Moorehead said.

Patterson echoed Moorehead when he said, "This feels like home."

The Gryrenes had been without such a home for 1,400 days, by Patterson's count. Patterson pointed out for Ave Maria senior basketball and volleyball players in four years they never played a home game or match in the field house.

Now, the men's and women's basketball teams and the volleyball team have a facility to call their own.

"It means everything to us," volleyball coach Teigan McCormick said.

The new Tom Golisano Field House is important to all 23 of Ave Maria University's sport teams, even those who play outdoors such as the baseball and football teams.

"The weight room obviously satisfies the need for all 23 of our sports teams," Patterson said. "That is a big improvement over what we had."

Patterson doesn't know the precise square footage of the old weight room but knows the new one is bigger and offers more power racks.

Teams are now able to schedule practices at more convenient times. Previously, when using the nearby Donahue gym, practices scheduled there had to be juggled with other users of the facilities. That meant both basketball teams found themselves practicing either very early in the morning or late at night at the Donahue gym, which is owned by the Diocese of Venice.

The wait for the new home was long but it was worth it for AMU athletes and coaches.

Basketball player Miles Monchecourt certainly recalls seeing the finished field

the facility.

"It is super special to have access to a facility like this," he said.

The men's basketball roster has players from 10 states.

The women's basketball team has seven Floridians but also features players from New York, Ohio and Spain.

The volleyball team roster lists five Floridians but also players from Portugal, Brazil and Canada.

Sophomore volleyball player Abbey Grose is from Brighton, Mich. and is helping spread the word about the new field house.

"I have past teammates that are younger than me," Grose said. "I'm trying to get them to come here and play."

The new and improved field house should help.

"A big selling point for sure," Grose said.

The overhaul was designed by BSSW Architects and includes a sound-proof curtain between courts, a new roof, and HVAC system and plumbing.

That's all in addition to the upgrades for the teams.

"It is more functional for a collegiate athletic department," Copeland said.

not only about the university but about weight racks and more convenient practice times. Sophomore basketball player Casey Humphrey suggested camaraderie could be enhanced.,

> "Just having the environment of our space brings us together," said Humphrey, a juror guard from Columbus, Ohio.

She recalled the sensation of walking into the field house for the first game there.

"It was nerve-wracking but exciting," Humphrey said.

Athletes and coaches all appreciated the access to Donahue and the hospitality they were shown but it was not their home.

"You're always feeling like you're invading somebody else's space," Moorehead said.

The new field house is a treat for Patterson and the 600 student/athletes in a university with an enrollment of 1,200. About 100 athletes play football.

He was named athletic director in May of 2020.

Patterson said the previous athletic director resigned the day after the old field house was condemned.

While the renovation work continued the school's sports teams persevered. Patterson appreciates how athletes coped.

"Seeing what the athletes have done in the pursuit of excellence over the last four years has just been remarkable," Patterson said.

He said he never heard a coach or athlete complain.

'They never stopped pursuing excellence," Patterson said.

Patterson then used a word beyond remarkable.

"To see the steps the teams have made "I had never had a field house," Patter- the last four years," Patterson said, "has just been inspiring." 💐

Now, teams don't have to practice very early or very late in a facility shared by a neighboring school. They have regular practice times. They have nice locker rooms and weights rooms and places to study game film and plan strategy.

"One- stop shopping," Copeland said. Moorehead also appreciates those benefits

He said it is "great logistically."

It means having the ability for players to pop into the field house and work on their game on their own if they like.

"It's been a blessing," Moorehead said. One of the blessings may be a byproduct of the tangible elements of more



The Fegers recounted that one of the more difficult parts of this journey was seeing the effects it had on the rest of their children, specifically Serafina's older sister.

"I think it's obviously hard at first because she lost her playmate. Her everyday playmate who was suddenly sitting on the couch in an excruciating amount of pain," Elizabeth said.

"We were really trying to make sure that she maintained as normal of a schedule as possible and that we were talking to her through it, allowing her to be a part of the experience," Brett said. "I think that's the best way that she would be able to process and cope, versus being completely removed from it and having more thoughts of 'What's going on?"

Deeply ingrained in the town of Ave Maria, Brett and Elizabeth Feger found solace through the support of their community. As long-time town residents and staff members of Ave Maria University, the Fegers turned to their friends, family and faith to get through the difficult times.

"We were really surrounded by the community here. The support we received from the university, as well as the town, was just incredible," Elizabeth said.

In addition to the chemotherapy and MEK inhibitor used to treat Serafina's condition, the Fegers believed that supplementing treatment with natural care was imperative in aiding the young girl's health journey.

"Seek out care beyond normal medicine. We have a naturopathic oncologist in Arizona because you've got to find ways to support the body while it's going through treatment," Brett

From One Flush to Thousands: Ave Maria Utility Company's Expansion

The history of Ave Maria Utility Company (AMUC) can be traced back to the flushing of one toilet in March of 2007.

Whose toilet? Senior project manager Jason Vogel can't precisely pinpoint that but knows it was in a commercial building.

As the community has blossomed and grown, so has the demand for fresh water and wastewater treatment.

That's why the company is expanding its capacity for delivering fresh water and continuing to turn wastewater into reclaimed water for irrigation throughout Ave Maria.

The explanation is simple, according to Vogel.

"Why would we expand?" Vogel asked, sitting in a conference room at the company's second-floor offices in the First Foundation Bank building in downtown Ave Maria.

In December of 2008, the company had 196 residential connections. Now, the customer count is closing in on 4,000.

Service has not been interrupted once in all those years.

"We weathered two hurricanes [Irma and Ian] and never had a break of service," Vogel said.

He said each residence in Ave Maria averages 127 gallons per day. There are many variables such as size of the home and number of residents and whether appliances are high efficiency or not.

When Ave Maria was founded, the assumption was each house would average 250 gallons a day, but the technology of high efficiency appliances and toilets have cut into the average.

Where does all the water come from that is used for drinking and laundry and cooking?

"We are blessed with a lot of ground water in this area," Vogel said. "The state drains to the south. We enjoy that benefit. So, we take it for granted to an extent."

Florida has aquifers which supply water to millions of residents and visitors. Where precisely do Ave Maria residents



get their water?

"Good question," Vogel said. The water source is the lower Tamiami aquifer, which, according to the United States Geological Survey website, is located beneath nearby Bonita

Springs. AMUC will move its source to the sandstone aquifer.

"It's deeper," Vogel said of sandstone. "It's harder to get to." Sandstone's water is about 325 feet below the surface vs. 60-to-75 feet for the lower Tamiami, according to Vogel. But going

deeper will pay off. "The water is better," Vogel said.

He added that the sandstone provides "a pure water."

Will customers notice? "Most people are not going

to notice the difference," Vogel said.

It's all part of the expansion and why adding capacity is necessary in the bustling community.

Ave Maria has more residents and more visitors. Meaning it has more toilets, washing machines, dishwashers, showers, sinks and faucets.

It all started with that one toilet in 2007, 17 years ago.

"That was a significant day," Vogel said.

Now, there are thousands of customers and more nearly

every day. Plant manager Paul Cortez is well aware of his mission in serving the community.

"We just got to make sure that we are not only compliant [with regulations] but that we do it cost effectively," Cortez said. "We look to take care of our clients, which are the people of Ave Maria, and we respond to any concerns, and we just try to keep everything up and running."

The wastewater plant's daily capacity is 900,000 gallons, according to Vogel. Plant expansion will allow for 1.8 million gallons a day. All of it is re-purposed for irrigation through the use of biological organisms and

not chemicals.

What comes into the plant as waste goes out as irrigation.

"One hundred percent is re-purposed," Vogel said. "Not a drop wasted."

Vogel is a familiar figure around town. In 2020 an Ave Maria Sun story on Vogel carried this headline: "The Wizard of Water."

The Wizard and his

growing staff continue working their magic as the community grows. In 2008, AMUC had seven employees and now has 27. It also moved in 2022 from a 2,025-square foot office space in the Town Center to its 4,246-square foot current location.

All those people and all that space are needed to service the needs of customers.

And then at some point, more plant expansion may be needed. As Vogel talked in the conference room he looked up at a PowerPoint on a screen with statistics and charts and projections.

"We may have to do a fourth one depending on what happens way out here," Vogel said, gesturing to a projected timeline on the screen. "Beyond my crystal ball's credibility and accuracy."

But he has to prepare.

"I have to take the worst-case scenarios so that's my job," Vogel said. "Make sure I have adequate capacity depending on what my development people [town developer Barron Collier Companies] throw at me and the developer people I say in a friendly manner because we all work for the same group."

The projections show 13,000 to 14,000 residents around the year 2040.

"So, that's why we're expanding," Vogel said. The goals will be the same in 2040 as

they are in 2024 and as they were when the community was founded.

But Vogel believes residents will not notice anything different.

"We're going to maintain the same standards," Vogel said.

The standards are high. AMUC won an award for best tasting water in the Collier Hendry and Lee counties region in 2010, 2014, 2021 and 2022. The award was bestowed by the American Water Works Association.

The plant is located off Ave Maria Boulevard behind a berm and a copse of trees. It's essentially out of sight and out of mind.

"At the end of the day this is behind the curtain," Vogel said.

Where fresh, clean water comes from and where wastewater goes are topics most people likely don't give a moment's thought to during the course of a day. Vo-

gel understands that.

"Sometimes I'd like them to think about it," Vogel said. "It's like, 'Mommy, does meat come from Publix?""

No, the meat comes from someplace else and the origin of the water coming out of Ave Maria faucets comes from wells and pipes out of sight.

"We don't advertise it," Vogel said. "It just happens."

As the community continues growing Vogel knows more expansion will be needed.

"We're going to have another phase right around 2032," Vogel said.

But residents will likely be unaware of anything going on.

"People take it for granted," Vogel said. "Like they take hamburger meat at Publix." $2^{1/2}$

Exotic Plant Removal: Collier Environmental Services' Role in Ave Maria's Ecosystem

When the Barron Collier Companies (BCC) embarked on the development of Ave Maria, the team knew that creating an entire community would require compliance with various county ordinances. Constructing a whole new town comes with diverse provisions and requirements, so in 2002, the Rural Land Stewardship (or RSLA) was adopted to create a land-use plan to protect agricultural areas, natural habitats, wetlands and flow ways, while directing growth to more sustainable mixed-use patterns from these areas. Since the RLSA's implementation more than 50,000 acres of Florida habitat has been preserved. BCC's master-planned community, Ave Maria, was the first town developed under the Rural Land Stewardship Area program, setting aside 17,000 acres for conservation.

"There were requirements we had to comply with to generate accumulate the credits to proceed with the development of Ave Maria," explained David Genson, President of Development for BCC. "Within that space, we have pristine wetland areas, preservation areas, as well as agricultural land and easements for future use."

In 2006, the BCC founded Collier Environmental Services (CES); a separate arm of the multi-faceted company which maintains, restores and preserves natural landscapes for Ave Maria and other Southwest Florida communities. This new enterprise proved so necessary and effective that it has now grown and evolved into an environmental consultancy that not only oversees lands within Barron Collier's properties but also helps other developers and local governments fulfill their ecological goals.

"At Ave Maria, we constantly have to monitor the lands and clear the ground of invasive plants," Genson said. Known as exotics, these plants are not native to Florida or the neighboring foliage and require teams to eradicate these invasive species and replant vegetation more appropriate for Florida's ecosystem. "Our crews are always out walking the grounds looking for bad plants."

Why is constant monitoring necessary? Florida has its own unique hurdles. Though the state is known for its weather, sometimes that weather proves problematic for sustaining natural spaces. "Florida has special problems we have to deal with," Genson said. "Hurricanes and winds really impact the preserves. The wind blows seeds that do not belong here surprisingly far

uistances.

Still dealing with damaged parcels from Hurricane Ian last year, Genson said some of the worst spaces are still being repaired and date as far back as Hurricane Wilma. "Wilma was more of a wind event and seeds were dispersed from miles away," resulting in botanical specimens that do not belong here.

The repair methods often require taking the spaces down to bare ground. But the results of this attention are visible in Ave Maria's natural resources and thriving wildlife. Whether it is the wetlands of Camp Keais Strand or the scenery of nearby Corkscrew Swamp, the environmental mission conceived at Ave Maria's founding is evident when you step outside and embrace the nature surrounding you.
