When Barbara first started the league in 2016, it was a modest gathering of just four women. Today, it has grown to more than 150 members who meet weekly for tee time on the 18-hole Panther Run golf course.

"He was the golfer. I'd just ride along and caddy," Barbara Mariano shared. "But I started to play, and then I started a league. It's a casual group, and it's very supportive. Everybody's there to help everybody. You don't have to have a handicap to play in the group just a good attitude!

Barbara's commitment to helping others extends beyond the golf course. In October 2023, she lost her husband to cancer.

In honor of her late spouse and to support others battling the disease, Barbara spearheads several fundraising efforts, including the annual Kiss Cancer Goodbye Golf Tournament held at Panther Run Golf Club. In addition, she plans the Cancer Alliance of Naples (CAN) Fashion Show, an event at Del Webb Naples that raises proceeds for CAN. Between the golf pro shop and The Secret Ingredient boutique clothing is featured by Ave Maria residents who walk the show.

Her dedication to community connection is also reflected in her personal life. Every first Monday of the month, Barbara and a group of friends

enjoy a happy hour at one of Ave Maria's Town Center restaurants. "My kids were like, 'Mom, we know you've got a great support system.' They don't worry about me," she said with a smile.

Despite the tribulations, Barbara remains a vibrant figure in her world of Del Webb, always looking for ways to contribute and uplift others. "I think of it as personal growth," she said. As she continues to lead the golf league, organize events for philanthropic efforts and foster community spirit, Barbara Mariano exemplifies the very essence of what it means to be a neighbor and a friend in Ave Maria - A Big Kind of Small Town. 🏒





Umami Ave

A flavorful fusion of Southeast Asian cuisine set to open in Ave Maria

This April, Ave Maria welcomes a new restaurant to the Midtown Plaza that is sure to please Asian food connoisseurs. Umami Ave is the brainchild of Jason Cao, a self-taught chef eager to share his favorite dishes inspired by Vietnamese, Thai, Cambodian and Japanese cuisine. Decorated with live plants and artistic photographs of Vietnamese life, the restaurant will seat about 50 people in tables and booths.

"Ever since I was a kid, I always wanted to open a restaurant," Cao recalled. "I love to cook and see the joy in people eating good food. All of my recipes come from the older generation. I don't want their recipes to be lost."

Although born in Vietnam, Cao moved to the United States when he was 4 years old. Growing up, he loved to watch his parents in the kitchen. His mother was the primary cook, but in America, she joined the workforce, and his father would often come home early and start dinner.

"My dad became a very good cook," Cao said. "He gives all the credit to my mother, saying she taught him how to cook, but the flavor from his dishes is amazing. I, myself, started cooking in college when I was missing home-cooked meals."

Over the years, Cao has developed a sophisticated palate. "You learn how to identify different flavors. It's all out of curiosity. I'm always asking people how they cooked a dish. If I eat something I really like, I work on it so that I can achieve the same taste, the same texture and the same look. It's all about technique. You can give 10 people the same exact recipe, and it will come out 10 different ways, so that's the challenge and the art. It's very creative," he said.

Cao's artistry is a fusion of Southeast Asian flavors and cooking styles; his menu

celebrate will dishes famous different from often regions, adding a twist or novelty to make it unique and extra tasty. His

shrimp tempura, for example, will embellish the battered-and-fried Japanese dish by pre-marinating the shrimp with savory Vietnamese flavors and using a smoother and crisper batter.

The sushi rolls will include both traditional ingredients and subtle surprises. The Pad Kra Pao ground pork over rice will be

rich sauce with holy basil, shallots, garlic and green onions. The Japanese tataki tuna will be cooked on a very hot grill to add a smoky flavor and then served over a Vietnamese-inspired salad with tomatoes and fresh fruits.

One of Cao's favorite dishes is phở —a Vietnamese soup consisting of broth, rice

noodles, herbs, vegetables and meat. "I never get bored of pho, and I'm very excited to share my recipe for beef and chicken phở," he

said. "It takes eight to 10 hours to make the broth. There's a shortcut, but it doesn't taste the same. It's all about harmony and balance. To achieve the awesome umami flavor, I use salt and sugar, which are essential to life."

This unique, savory flavor is the very essence of Ave Maria's newest eating esimbued with Thai flavors and sautéed in a tablishment. "The restaurant is named

Cultural bridge

How international students enrich Ave Maria University

Each year, students from all over the globe come to Ave Maria University (AMU) to pursue their scholastic and career dreams. For most, English is their second language, but they are undaunted by challenges as they immerse themselves in a different culture, deepen their spirituality, make lasting friendships and expand their worldview. These enterprising individuals are welcomed and supported by a cadre of university professors, coaches, tutors and administrators.

Diana Tsai, a native of Colombia, has a dual role at the university. As the International Student Support Advisor, she helps foreign students integrate into the university lifestyle and thrive scholastically. As the Designated School Official, she ensures that every student entering this country completes the necessary paperwork correctly and complies with all U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) requirements.

"I get to know most of these students very well. If they have a need, they know to come to me. My office is always open for them," Tsai said. "Sometimes they get jobs, but they can only work on campus, so I guide them through the process, which includes getting a social security number. I have to make sure that they are going to their classes and scoring good grades. If they're struggling, I try to help them—send them to tutoring or encourage them to talk to their professors."

AMU currently has 46 international students from 23 countries, including Austria, Canada, Democratic Republic of Congo, France, Germany, Ghana, Hungary, India, Mexico, Montenegro, Paraguay, Portugal, Serbia, Spain and the United Kingdom. Seven are pursuing doctorate or master's degrees, and the rest are undergraduates. Their chosen fields of study include biology, business administration, chemistry, communications, economics, nursing, physics, computer science and theology.

Many of these students have full or partial sports scholarships, representing the Gyrenes in soccer, swimming, tennis, volleyball and even ultimate frisbee. With the help of recruiting agencies, Head Coach Cesar Markovic recruited nine of the team's 40 soccer players from Ecuador, Montenegro, Paraguay, Serbia, and St. Vincent and the Grenadines.

"European and South American countries have a long tradition of professional soccer clubs. Kids grow up playing in

those clubs with the goal of getting to the professional level. Many of them, if they're serious students, look to attend a school in the United States on a scholarship," Markovic explained. "Because they've been training to be professionals, they tend to be disciplined and used to high standards of play and training. Those are some of the qualities that we look for."

In addition to being stellar players, these recruits must meet AMU's high academic standards.

"We have a very challenging curriculum where writing and reading are massive requirements, and these guys are doing all this in a second language, which is definitely not easy," Markovic explained. "But we have a phenomenal network of tutors that help, and eventually they start to figure it out on their own."

With a father from Yugoslavia (now Montenegro) and a mother from Ecuador, he speaks Spanish, affording him a comfort level with the Spanish-speaking players.

"We understand each other. I'm American and I understand what it is to be an American, but I also understand them because I grew up in a very ethnic environment with a lot of different cultures," he remarked. "For internationals coming here, I think that they feel comfortable when somebody is able to understand them and speak to them and relate to them."

Sophomore Jose Jacquet, who was recruited into the men's soccer team from Paraguay, has been playing the game since he was a child, reaching a level of

proficiency and passion that got him noticed by Coach Markovic.

"My family and I researched the Ave Maria University website and also the city itself," he said. "I felt called to come here."

Pursuing a major in finance and a minor in accounting, Jacquet believes that ception desk in the campus weight room.

studying abroad offers many benefits.

"You gain a quality education, and you get to experience new perspectives," Jacquet said. "The experience pushes you out of your comfort zone and helps you to grow, mature and be more independent. I think the cultural exchange is really good both for yourself and for other people, and you get to build connections and develop a global

Jacquet relishes the time he gets to spend with his teammates.

"It's like a brotherhood. On and off the field, we push each other to be better," he said. "The community is super welcoming. They don't judge anything about you. It's a place where I feel I can be myself. I don't have to be hiding things about me

or not saying things. I can be who I am."
Another common experience for international students is the melancholy of being far away from home.

"One thing is being here from another state—not to minimize that—but being here from another continent and different time zone where it's sometimes challenging to call home just because of the time difference can be tough," Markovic said.

Ines Lopes, a junior from Portugal, has a volleyball scholarship and is pursuing a psychology degree. In addition to missing her family and friends, she also misses the familiar and cultural touchstones of her heritage.

"The music is different in Portugal, and I miss that a lot," she said. "Music back home makes you want to move your body. It's very energetic. And the fact that it's in Portuguese also helps a lot. I relate to it better. Sometimes, I get tired of speaking English or listening to English, and I just want something that feels natural to me."

Under current immigration law, international students may only seek on-campus employment, and taking part-time jobs around school is not unusual. Lopes is a Spanish tutor and also works at the reception desk in the campus weight room.

Jacquet helps out in the maintenance department, as well as in the intercollegiate athletics department.

Tharcisse Onema, from Congo, and Richard Mugisha, from Uganda, are both pursuing a master's degree in theology. As campus ministry priests, their duties include giving spiritual talks, leading and celebrating the sacraments of mass and confession with students, sports teams and

student clubs known as "households."

This is Onema's first time in the United States and his first time outside of his country.

"This great experience that I'm having here opened my mind to understand and speak English," Onema said. "The limit of your world is the limit of your language. When you learn another language, the world is open for you. In the U.S. and at Ave Maria University, the teachers give you books to read and discuss with them. In my country, especially in my area of Tshumbe, we do not have a library or access to books. Instead, teachers give students handouts to memorize."

Mugisha said, "It was easy to integrate with the American students. They were welcoming and easy to talk to them. I'm on the campus almost all the time, so I meet the students in the cafeteria, in the chapel, in the classroom, in the library. It's so easy to interact with each other. They are free with me, and I am free with them."

For Mugisha—as with many other international students—the biggest adjustment to life in the United States has to do with American cuisine.

"In Uganda, we grow food in our own fields and gardens and bring them to the table," he explained. "My favorite American dish is a chicken hamburger."

Upon graduation, Onema and Mugi-

sha will either continue their studies at AMU to obtain their doctorate degrees in theology, or they will return to their countries to teach at their local seminary and serve other priestly duties. The decision will depend upon their bishops back home.


A big benefit of studying abroad is that the students are able to explore stateside work opportunities after graduation. Tsai said about 90% decide to do just that. US-CIS approval is required, and the work has to be in the student's field of study. STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) students have the option to remain in such employment for up to three

years; all others can stay for up to one year. AMU Director of Career Services John Spadaccini can help them prepare resumes and find good jobs. Sometimes, the company they've been working for likes the job they are doing, so they will offer to sponsor them with an H1 work visa, Tsai shared.

"I think international students are a gift to us," Markovic said. "They enhance our community with their vibrance on campus and their commitment to following the path that we're all following. We may come from all corners of the world, but we are all believers, and that's the biggest thing we have in common."

and eastern Collier County.

"Together, we've reached a remarkable milestone that reflects both of our organizations' commitment to prioritizing health and wellness for the residents of Ave Maria and eastern Collier County," BCC Chief Executive Officer Blake Gable said. "We welcome NCH and their medical professionals to the community and look forward to continuing to enhance the health care options within the town."

Few community assets have the power to enhance quality of life, such as comprehensive and convenient medical facilities. While Ave Maria offers various medical services, and fitness and recreation amenities for its residents, nearby access to an Advanced Community Health System has remained one of the final pieces of the puzzle until now.


"Obviously, this is one of the fastest growing areas in the state of Florida, not just in Southwest Florida," NCH Chief Operating Officer Jonathan Kling said. "The number of families moving in every year and the distance from health care makes this something that is really a need for our community. Having good health care facilities nearby is what this community deserves, and we're happy to be a part of it."

"It's exciting for our community to have this major health care system committed to Ave Maria and eastern Collier County to meet the growing demands of health care throughout the county," said Cee Cee Marinelli, BCC VP of commercial real estate.

As eastern Collier County continues to grow, the collaboration between NCH and BCC will bring a 6,000-square-foot immediate care clinic to Ave Maria's Midtown Plaza. The location will be staffed by board-certified emergency physicians, physician assistants and nurses, who will treat non-life-threatening illnesses and injuries.

"This is going to be urgent care that will see walk-ins from cuts, sprained ankles and fractures to low-level acute care," Kling said. "As a health care professional, I'm also a registered nurse, it's what we do, we're in the business of taking care of our community. This is a community health system so it's the community's asset. It's amazing."

Key services at the new facilities will feature a pediatrics and women's health

office building that will be built in the Park of Commerce. The office building will have space for pediatrics, women's and maternal health, and specialists in areas such as cardiology, orthopedics and sports medicine will visit the office on a rotating basis, so residents don't need to travel to Naples.

"Right now, primary care is not very easily accessible. It's a pretty substantial drive to get the services if you live in Ave

Maria or even east of that," Kling said. "So being able to drive just a few miles to have that kind of care is going to be a game changer, I believe, for the health of our community."

The future is rife with plans as the big picture of health care in the region continues to move into fo-

cus. After the physician offices and immediate care clinic are established, NCH plans to open and operate a 24-hour freestanding emergency room facility (FSED) modeled after their two existing FSEDs in Northeast Collier and Bonita Springs. Once this phase of development is complete, the location near the main entrance to Ave Maria will offer emergency services for conditions such as broken bones, heart attack, stroke, se-

vere burns, severe allergic reactions and more.

The timeline for implementing this infusion of health care in the region is fairly ambitious. The immediate care facility is expected to open in approximately a month. Within the next couple of years, NCH will complete the addition of women's and children's primary care along with a full, freestanding emergency room with imaging, therapy and medical

offices.

Plans on the NCH drawing board call for the development of a full-service inpatient hospital that will serve the needs of the entire northeast county region. The current population of Ave Maria is approaching 15,000 residents, which is also factoring in the in-

creasing population in the surrounding eastern Collier County area. There is the expectation that the need and demand for lifelong care will rise along with the influx of residents. Growth projections for the region indicate additional features will need to be added to the ambitious plans (already coming to fruition) to expand the campus, along with the number and level of services offered.

Part of addressing those complex ne-

cessities will be the addition of an assisted living facility that will be built in Ave Maria, which will offer both assisted living and long-term care.

The Ave Maria lifestyle is often referred to as "living in A Big Kind of Small Town," which is about enjoying a lifestyle replete with big conveniences and small treasures. It's a philosophy that promises residents shouldn't have to make sacrifices regarding choices or convenience. Keeping essential goods and services a golf cart ride away from the front door is a comforting way to maintain household harmony and physical and mental wellness.





Two decades of Ave Maria

The ongoing evolution of a Big Kind of Small Town

What's your favorite pizza topping? While the toppings may vary, one thing's certain—a great crust is essential. It's the foundation, just like the vision behind Ave Maria, the town that the founder of Domino's Pizza, Tom Monaghan, envisioned. Just as pizza caters to every taste, Ave Maria continues to grow, appealing to a diverse population.

liest days. Construction began in 2005, and the local historian recalls the ceremonial groundbreaking on Feb. 17, 2006. "I remember when the roads were dirt," he remarked.

The first residents began moving in July 2007, and the pace has continued. Joe Marinelli, who has conducted the community's in-season trolley tours for the past 20 years, has had a first-hand look at Ave Maria's growth.

"I have had over 50,000 people on trolley tours for these past 20 years. I remember when the Church was steel coming out of the ground," he said.



Kicking off success

Youth soccer at Olfos Sports Academy

Since 2023, the Olfos Sports Academy has been offering Ave Maria kids the opportunity to play recreational soccer with the supervision and training of licensed instructors. Toddlers to teens are welcome to come to North Park and enjoy the world's most popular ballgame every Tuesday and Thursday evening. After the current season ends on April 31, a new season will begin in October and run through the end of April 2026.

The children are divided into age groups. The 2- to 5-year-olds meet from 5 to 5:45 p.m., the 6- to 12-year-olds meet from 6 to 7:30 p.m., and teenagers meet from 6 to 8 p.m. When there are enough girls, they get to play each other; otherwise, co-ed play is encouraged.

"My main focus for the academy is to provide an affordable option for families," Founder and CEO Jose Olfos said, who is licensed and certified as a soccer instructor, nutrition coach, personal trainer and world rugby coach. "Our fee is \$70 per month, and other programs like ours are charging \$120 for fewer hours of play and instruction.'

The Olfos Sports Academy is a nonprofit, so fees are considered donations. They also accept sponsorships from parents and other interested parties starting at \$1,000 per season.

On league nights, six to seven instructors-including Olfos-are there to lend their expertise and guidance. All of them are licensed Grassroots trainers by the U.S. Soccer Learning Center. The Grassroots designation is for local, recreational and amateur levels of play.

Olfos has applied to the Florida Youth Soccer Association to create a competitive league that would allow children aged 9 or older to challenge other competitive leagues in the region. The approval process is expected to take a couple of months, so it is conceivable that these kids will be able to compete soon.

"I'm looking to develop new talent

that the youngsters are enhancing their physical health, appreciating the great outdoors, getting off their screens, learning teamwork, having fun and making friends.

Another initiative in the works is a class for children and adults that integrates rugby into a physical fitness and wellness program.

'This will be for middle grades and up," Olfos shared. "We want to help people get healthier and feel better while playing a great sport."

"The Olfos Sports Academy has been a great addition to our North Park youth sports and activities," said Joseph Lampkin, Ave Maria Parks and Recreation manager. "The Ave Maria Master Association has welcomed the partnership and will continue to help in ways that contribute to growing this soccer program. Jose Olfos puts a lot of time and effort into preparing the fields for his training sessions and games. His program offers a professional and well-operated soccer development program, and his coaches are focused on providing a great learning and fun environment for the youth of Ave Maria."

Youth soccer leagues meet every Tuesday and Thursday evening at North Park, 4010 Anthem Parkway, in Ave Maria. 


